CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations - Morticians and Funeral Directors - Apprenticeships

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the cap on the number of years that an applicant for a mortician or funeral director license may spend as an apprentice, except under 4 5 certain circumstances, to be issued a license; requiring certain applicants and 6 licensed apprentices to submit to the Maryland State Board of Morticians and 7 Funeral Directors a certain letter; altering a certain education requirement for an individual appearing before the Maryland State Board of Morticians and Funeral 8 9 Directors for approval of an apprentice license; requiring a licensed apprentice who 10 was enrolled in a mortuary science program at the time the license was granted to 11 be enrolled in the program for the duration of the apprenticeship unless the licensed 12 apprentice graduates; clarifying that the practical experience of an apprentice is 13 required to include at least a certain number of working hours; making this Act an 14 emergency measure; and generally relating to apprenticeships under the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors. 15

direction only as part of a training program to become a licensed mortician or funeral
