## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Pharmacists – Aids for the Cessation of Tobacco Product Use

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a pharmacist who meets the requirements of certain 4 regulations to prescribe and dispense certain aids for the cessation of the use of 5 tobacco products; requiring the State Board of Pharmacy, on or before a certain date, 6 to adopt regulations establishing certain procedures and conditions relating to the 7 prescribing and dispensing of certain aids for the cessation of the use of tobacco 8 products; requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and the Maryland 9 Children's Health Program to provide coverage for certain services rendered by a licensed pharmacist under this Act to the same extent as certain services rendered 10 11 by any other licensed health care practitioner; altering a certain definition; and 12 generally relating to the prescribing and dispensing of aids for the cessation of the 13 use of tobacco products.

- 4 (A) A PHARMACIST WHO MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE REGULATIONS
- 5 ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY PRESCRIBE AND DISPENSE MEDICATIONS
- 6 APPROVED BY THE U.S. FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION AS AN AID FOR THE
- 7 CESSATION OF THE USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS.
- 8 (B) (1) ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1, 2021, THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT 9 REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING:
- 10 (I) STANDARD PROCEDURES THAT A PHARMACIST SHALL USE 11 TO:
- 12 1. Prescribe and dispense to a patient the
- 13 APPROPRIATE AID FOR THE CESSATION OF THE USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS BY THE

- 7 HEALTH RECORD MAINTAINED FOR THE PATIENT BY THE PHARMACIST.
- 8 (3) THE REGULATIONS SHALL WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT TO
- 9 COMPLETE THE TRAINING PROGRAM UNDER PARAGRAPH (2)(I) OF THIS
- 10 SUBSECTION FOR A PHARMACIST WHO ALREADY HAS UNDERGONE THE TRAINING AS
- 11 PART OF THE PHARMACIST'S FORMAL EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 13 October 1, 2020.
