- 1 AN ACT concerning
- 2 Task Force to Study the Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise Program
- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Veteran-Owned Small 4 Business Enterprise Program; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of 5 the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain 6 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 7 Task Force to study and make recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor 8 9 and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination 10 of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study the Veteran-Owned 11 Small Business Enterprise Program.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 13 That:
- 14 (a) In this section, "veteran–owned small business enterprise" has the meaning stated in § 14–601 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 16 (b) There is a Task Force to Study the Veteran–Owned Small Business Enterprise 17 Program.
- 18 (c) The Task Force consists of the following members:

It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2021, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
