SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any provision in the 17 declaration, bylaws, rules, deeds, agreements, or recorded covenants or restrictions of a 18 homeowners association, beginning on the date on which [all lots] ANY LOT that may be 19 part of the development [have] HAS been subdivided and recorded in the land records of 20 the county in which the homeowners association is located, the declarant, when voting on 21 a homeowners association matter, shall be entitled to one vote per lot that:

(1) Has been subdivided and recorded in the land records of the county inwhich the homeowners association is located; and





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(2) Has not been sold to members of the public.

2 (b) Before the date on which [all lots] ANY LOT that may be part of the 3 development [have] HAS been subdivided and recorded in the land records of the county in 4 which the homeowners association is located, the declarant, when voting on a homeowners 5 association matter, shall be entitled to the number of votes set forth in the governing 6 documents of the homeowners association.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2020.
