Electricity Suppliers and Gas Suppliers – Consumer Protections

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Office of People's Counsel to investigate and request 4 certain documents from an electricity supplier or a gas supplier under certain 5 circumstances; requiring the Office of People's Counsel to have a reasonable basis 6 before initiating a certain investigation; requiring an electricity supplier or a gas 7 supplier to provide certain written responses and documents to the Office of People's 8 Counsel under certain circumstances; prohibiting an electricity supplier or a gas 9 supplier from switching a customer's rate for electricity or gas supply from a fixed rate to a variable rate without the customer's written consent; limiting the amount 10 11 of a certain early termination or cancellation fee of a retail electricity or gas supply 12 contract; requiring certain electricity bills to include certain information; requiring 13 the Public Service Commission to adopt regulations to require gas suppliers to 14 include certain information in certain gas bills; requiring the Commission to order 15 an electricity supplier or a gas supplier to cease and desist certain actions and to 16 take certain affirmative actions, including certain monetary restitution to certain 17 customers under certain circumstances; requiring the Commission to make certain determinations under certain circumstances; and generally relating to consumer 18 19 protections for customers of electricity suppliers and gas suppliers.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 Article – Public Utilities

- 5 (a) (1) The Office of People's Counsel shall evaluate each matter pending 6 before the Commission to determine if the interests of residential and noncommercial users 7 are affected.
- 8 (2) If the Office of People's Counsel considers the interest of residential and noncommercial users to be affected, the Office of People's Counsel shall appear before the Commission and courts on behalf of residential and noncommercial users in each matter or proceeding over which the Commission has original jurisdiction, including a proceeding on the rates, service, or practices of a public service company or on a violation of this division.
- 13 (3) As the Office of People's Counsel considers necessary, the Office of People's Counsel shall conduct investigations and request the Commission to initiate proceedings to protect the interests of residential and noncommercial users.

- 17 (1) the identity and phone number of the electricity supplier of the service;
- 18 (2) sufficient information to evaluate prices and services; [and]

- 2 (a) On or before July 1, 2001, the Commission shall adopt consumer protection 3 orders or regulations for gas suppliers that:
- 4 (1) protect consumers from discriminatory, unfair, deceptive, and 5 anticompetitive acts and practices in the marketing, selling, or distributing of natural gas;
- 6 (2) provide for contracting, enrollment, and billing practices and 7 procedures; [and]
- 8 (3) REQUIRES BILLS FOR GAS SUPPLY TO CONTAIN INFORMATION SET 9 FORTH IN A TABLE OR CHART THAT:
- 10 (I) COMPARES THE GAS SUPPLIER'S RATE TO THE APPLICABLE 11 GAS COMPANY'S GAS COMMODITY RATE;
- 12 (II) CALCULATES A COMPARISON OF THE COST OF GAS SUPPLY 13 BASED ON THE CUSTOMER'S MONTHLY USAGE WITH THE COMMODITY RATE; AND
- 14 (III) LISTS THE ACTUAL PRICE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE 15 RATES; AND
- 16 (4) the Commission considers necessary to protect the consumer.
- 17 (b) In adopting orders and regulations under this section, unless the Commission determines that the circumstances do not require consistency, the Commission shall:
- 19 (1) provide customers with protections consistent with applicable 20 protections provided to retail electric customers; and
- 21 (2) impose appropriate requirements on gas suppliers that are consistent 22 with applicable requirements imposed on electricity suppliers.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2020.
