3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Central Home Detention Unit within the Division of 4 Parole and Probation; authorizing the Director of the Division of Parole and $\mathbf{5}$ Probation to authorize certain employees of the Central Home Detention Unit to 6 exercise certain powers; requiring a certain employee to meet certain requirements; 7 authorizing a certain employee to exercise certain powers; including certain 8 employees of the Central Home Detention Unit in the defined term "police officer" in 9 connection with provisions of law relating to the authority to make arrests; including certain employees of the Central Home Detention Unit in the defined term "law 1011 enforcement officer" in connection with provisions of law relating to the Maryland 12Police Training and Standards Commission and the Law Enforcement Officers' Bill 13 of Rights; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the powers of certain employees of the Central Home Detention Unit of the Division of Parole and 14 Probation. 15
