1 AN ACT concerning

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## Commission on Minority- and Women-Owned Small Business Participation in State Procurement

FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Minority— and Women—Owned Small Business Participation in State Procurement; providing for the duties, membership, cochairs, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting members of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission to study, determine, review, and make recommendations regarding certain matters; authorizing the Commission to create certain committees for a certain purpose; providing for the designation of chairs and responsibilities of certain committees; requiring the Commission to report certain findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; declaring the intent of the General Assembly; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Commission on Minority— and Women—Owned Small Business Participation in State Procurement.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 17 That:

- 18 (a) There is a Commission on Minority– and Women–Owned Small Business 19 Participation in State Procurement.

- 10 (c) (1) The President of the Senate shall designate one of the members 11 appointed from the Senate of Maryland as a cochair of the Commission.
- 12 (2) The Speaker of the House shall designate one of the members appointed 13 from the House of Delegates as a cochair of the Commission.
- 14 (d) The Department of Legislative Services shall provide staff for the 15 Commission.
- 16 (e) A member of the Commission:

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- 17 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but
- 18 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 19 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- 20 (f) The Commission shall:
- 21 (1) study the current State practices concerning small, minority, and 22 women business participation in State procurement contracts;
- 23 (2) review State practices that have helped to improve outcomes for 24 minority— and women—owned small business enterprises and determine common indicators 25 of success between these practices;
- 26 (3) determine whether any statutory or regulatory provisions or State practices prevent minority— and women—owned small business enterprises from effectively competing for State procurement contracts;
- 29 (4) review the best practices of the federal government and other states to 30 improve outcomes for minority— and women—owned small business enterprises in public 31 procurement contracts; and
- 32 (5) make recommendations regarding best practices for engaging and 33 improving outcomes for minority— and women—owned small business enterprises in State
