1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Motor Vehicle Administration Police – Powers**

3 FOR the purpose of including a member of the Motor Vehicle Administration Police in the
4 defined term “police officer” in connection with provisions of law relating to the
5 authority to make arrests; including a member of the Motor Vehicle Administration
6 Police in the defined term “law enforcement officer” in connection with provisions of
7 law relating to the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission and the
8 Law Enforcement Officers’ Bill of Rights; and generally relating to the Motor Vehicle
9 Administration Police.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

24 to make arrests and is:

25 (25) a member of the police force of the Anne Arundel Community College;

27 (26) a member of the police department of the Johns Hopkins University
28 established in accordance with Title 24, Subtitle 12 of the Education Article; **OR**

29 **(27) A MEMBER OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION POLICE.**

32 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

1 (e) (1) “Law enforcement officer” means an individual who:

2 (i) in an official capacity is authorized by law to make arrests; and

10 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

11 (f) (1) “Police officer” means an individual who:

12 (i) is authorized to enforce the general criminal laws of the State;

14 (ii) is a member of one of the following law enforcement agencies:

15 21. the police force of the Anne Arundel Community College;

16 [or]

17 22. the police department of the Johns Hopkins University
18 established in accordance with Title 24, Subtitle 12 of the Education Article; **OR**

19 **23. THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION POLICE.**

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 October 1, 2020.
