SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a person who violates this 16 subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not 17 exceeding 3 years or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.

1 (b) (1) A person who violates § 10–304(2)(i) of this subtitle is guilty of a felony 2 and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 10 years or a fine not exceeding 3 \$10,000 or both.

4 (2) A person who violates § 10–304(2)(ii) of this subtitle is guilty of a felony 5 and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 20 years or a fine not exceeding 6 \$20,000 or both.

(C) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PENALTIES IMPOSED BY THIS SECTION, THE
 COURT SHALL MAY REQUIRE A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE TO
 COMPLETE AT LEAST 8 HOURS OF EDUCATIONAL INSTRUCTION RELATING TO THE
 GROUP OR COMMUNITY AGAINST WHOM THE PERSON CONVICTED HAS COMMITTED
 A-PROHIBITED ACT AN ANTI-BIAS EDUCATION PROGRAM.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2020.
