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Correctional Officers' Retirement System - Membership

3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System to include certain individuals serving in certain positions in the Department 4 5 of Juvenile Services; providing for the calculation of a certain benefit from the 6 Correctional Officers' Retirement System for individuals serving in certain positions 7 on or before a certain date; requiring the State Retirement Agency, on or before a 8 certain date, to notify certain individuals affected by this Act of their right to transfer 9 service credit to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; providing for the application of this Act; requiring a certain transfer and combination of certain 10 11 service credit for certain individuals; requiring the Board of Trustees for the State 12 Retirement and Pension System to calculate a certain disability benefit for certain 13 individuals and to grant a certain benefit under certain circumstances; and generally 14 relating to membership in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

- 25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 2021, 24the State Retirement Agency shall notify the individuals who are affected by this Act of their right to transfer service credit from the Employees' Retirement System or the 25 26 Employees' Pension System to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System. SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That § 37-203(f)(3) of the State 27 28 Personnel and Pensions Article does not apply to an individual who transfers service credit 29 to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System under Title 37 of the State Personnel and
- 31 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

Pensions Article in accordance with this Act.

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- (a) This section applies to an individual who:
 - (1) is employed in a position affected by this Act on July 1, 2020; and

1 (2) has no creditable service in the Employees' Pension System before July 2 1, 2008.

- (b) An individual described under subsection (a) of this section shall have the individual's service credit from the Employees' Pension System transferred and combined with the individual's service in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.
- (c) If an individual described under subsection (a) of this section is granted an ordinary disability benefit under Title 29, Subtitle 1 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall calculate the ordinary disability benefit under §§ 29–106 and 29–108 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article and grant the individual the greater benefit.
- SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
