## 28. Comments

The funds have been raised for Phase I and Post #77 is currently in preconstruction, with groundbreaking to commence in June 2020. Phase II will finish the project, and will focus on updating bathroom facilities, the Canteen and the front entrance which will house a permanent exhibit of the life and culture of the African American veterans of Post #77. The completion of this project is paramount to the sustained vitality and support that Post #77 offers to the residents of Easton.
