We have a mission to sustain and strengthen the Annapolis business community, preserve our heritage and make downtown Annapolis a better place for all of our residents, visitors, and businesses. We follow the National Trust for Historic Preservation established Main Street program. We partner with local governments, the Naval Academy, St. John's College, sponsors, residents, and local businesses to find ways to strengthen and preserve our community.</p>

The purpose of the project is to increase murals in downtown Annapolis. Murals in public spaces not only beautify a community they tell a story. The public art selected will be accessible to everyone and show the community its diverse heritage and highlight that people from all backgrounds helped shape our community. A story selected for this mural includes an image of women who 100 years ago came to the Maryland State House to urge Maryland legislators to pass legislation to allow Maryland women the right to vote. While much of our public art honors elected leaders or military leaders, this story honors everyday citizens working together for the greater good of their community. The mural will celebrate the women who helped expand voting rights to women. It will also remind people today that it is both important to get involved in the legislative process when you see an injustice in your community and that voting rights are an important right for all citizens.
