## **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

Forest Park Senior Center (FPSC, Inc.) is a 501(c)3 multi-purpose Center. It is an educational, recreation and social organization to enhance the health and well-being and life-skills of senior citizens in the greater Baltimore community. The FPSC, Inc. further serves as a key Polling Station, cultural and social action hub for this region of the city. It is a heating and cooling center for seniors at large, and serve as a focal point for multiple outreach services.
