#### **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

Itineris, an adult autism agency provides opportunities for autistic adults to participate meaningfully in all aspects of adult life. We are the only autism-specific agency in Baltimore City. Itineris provides pre-vocational skill assessments, discovery, job development, on-site supports and community support by highly trained staff. In school most autistic students are supported through special education providing necessary aids and accommodations. Upon exiting school, this support system is no longer available to them but the need for support as they face the challenges of adulthood are just as critical. Each year in Baltimore about 200 students with ASD will age out of the school system. This number will quadruple over the next decade.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Capital Campaign to purchase 2050 Rockrose is raising \$3,700,000 to increase our capacity to help more individuals and their families. We are requesting \$100,000 and have already secured matching funds. This purchase will double the original space and reduce our occupancy cost by 40%, allowing us to maintain our low staffing ratios and providing the high-quality support services for our adults. Maryland has the second highest prevalence of autism in the nation. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) estimates that 1 in 50 births in Maryland will be diagnosed on the autism spectrum. The increased space will provide a state-of-the-art workforce development hub and training space so that Itineris can train the numerous other professionals and organizations that have expressed interest in using the Itineris model.

### 28. Comments

After 10 years, Itineris is still the only agency in Baltimore City that is exclusively supporting autistic adults. DDA provides us partial support, leaving Itineris with a \$750,000 deficit per year that requires us to continuously fundraise. This deficit runs about \$7,000 per client per year, which is due to the intensive supports needed and low client to staff rations required to safely support the complex needs of autistic adults. Purchasing this building and paying off our mortgage will allow us to reduce our operating costs by 40%. This is critical in allowing us to grow and meet the huge demand for our services.

Our program is working. We use evidence-based strategies and best practices to support our adults. The national employment statistics reveal that 19.2-25% of autistic adults are employed or underemployed. At Itineris, 56% of our clients are gainfully employed in competitive, integrated workplaces. We have 55 unique employers and only do customized employment. As a community based program, 100% of our clients are in the community volunteering, doing internships, working in trial sites, practicing adult independent living skills and practicing travel and transportation training. Our hub at Rockrose provides a Workforce Center where we can teach our custom created classes in Work Readiness, Career Exploration, Job Discovery, Social Skills, independent living skills such as bed making, laundry, cooking. We have several tech centers to support clients in office practice, school work, online classes or how to safely use technology. Our Behavioral Services Department works on crisis prevention for maladaptive or self-injurious behavior, crisis training, behavior plans and monitoring, proactive strategies vs. reactive strategies, family training, community training on crisis, trauma informed care as well as providing sensory rooms and relaxation rooms for de-escalation.
