10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Linthicum Veterans Memorial was dedicated in 2010 to honor veterans from all of the branches of the armed forces and is located in the Historic District of Linthicum, Maryland. Currently 855 commemorative bricks have been installed representing conflicts dating back to the War of 1812 and Civil War. Each year the Linthicum Veterans Memorial hosts a Memorial Day Program and Community Cookout, an annual Veterans Day Program and a tree-lighting ceremony involving children's choirs from area churches and schools. Visitors to the Memorial have included astronauts, military chaplains and groups interested in erecting their own Memorial in their communities. It is also utilized throughout the year by community members to come and visit in remembrance of loved ones who served their community and country.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)
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No major maintenance has been performed on the Linthicum Veterans Memorial since its dedication in 2010. Annual cleanup, some initial tree removal and ground cover elimination has been performed. In addition, recent power washing of the Memorial and brick walkways and the erection of a temporary directory was completed. Obtaining this funding will permit us to:

1.Improve the lighting in and around the memorial

2. Repair/replace water damage to the capstones, plaques and erosion along the walkways

3. Erect a permanent locator directory with lighting

4. Remove decaying trees/shrubs in danger of damaging the Memorial and replace them with

additional plantings to beautify the grounds
