10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

VisArts is a non profit organization with a mission to transform individuals and communities through the visual arts. Since our founding in 1987, nearly 700,000 individuals of all ages and abilities have enjoyed innovative arts experiences that cultivate creativity, problem solving, and an appreciation for the visual arts. In addition to our arts education classes, VisArts showcases vibrant contemporary exhibitions in our four galleries, and provides artists with a collaborative environment to create new work in our artist studios. Through a host of outreach initiatives, VisArts reaches communities previously under-served by arts organizations including wounded vets, seniors, individuals with disabilities, and low income families and children. Supports include scholarships, artist stipends, and free and discounted classes.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

VisArts requests funding to support three capital upgrades necessary for the continuation and enhancement of our programs and services to the community: 1) replacement of the analog audio visual and control system in the organization's Buchanan Events rental room which is utilized by individuals, corporate clients, non-profit organizations, and VisArts gallery program (analog technology is being phased out by July 2020 rendering our system obsolete); 2) replacement of the aging and energy inefficient lighting system in the Kaplan Gallery which supports innovative gallery exhibitions and programming; and 3) replacement of aging HVAC equipment in our classrooms, event rental space, and galleries.

The Metropolitan Center for the Visual Arts (VisArts) is a non-profit organization with a mission to transform individuals and communities through the visual arts. Since our founding in 1987, VisArts has served early 700,000 individuals through its arts education program, artist studios, and gallery exhibitions. Each year, in an effort to serve populations under-represented by arts organizations, VisArts extends more than \$40,000 in free services to those wounded vets, seniors, individuals with disabilities and low income families and children through scholarships, artist stipends, and tuition discounts.

VisArts is focused on building a more connected community, working to understand the social issues affecting our world, actively promoting awareness of other perspectives, and fostering understanding through the visual arts. Our strength rests in our ability to bring together through shared creative experiences, fostering exposure to new perspectives and mutual respect. The VisArts community is comprised of people of all ages, identities, backgrounds, experiences, and abilities. We work to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to nurture his or her creative spark by creating and engaging with art.

Since its inception, VisArts has enjoyed support from the City of Rockville ranging from rent-free space provided when the organization first started to the current rent abatement in its home in the Arts and Innovation Center in downtown Rockville. The facility was built in 2007 when the City of Rockville, in partnership with private developers, Montgomery County, and the State of Maryland joined in collaboration on a large scale development project in Rockville Town Square. Today, VisArts is an anchor in Rockville Town Square and serves as an economic driver bringing visitors from Montgomery County, D.C., Baltimore, and Northern Virginia to the area for art initiatives, festivals, and creative placemaking activities and to enjoy the areas restaurants and stores.

While VisArts receives rent assistance from the City of Rockville, it is responsible for all capital improvements, enhancements, and repairs of equipment including, the extensive HVAC system with 26 separate air handlers which control heat and air conditioning, carpet/flooring, lighting, plumbing, electricity, and a sound and audio visual system. As a non-profit organization, with marginal reserves, these capital expenditures can be extremely burdensome.

The outlined capital improvements will enable VisArts to continue working towards our vision of a vibrant, diverse community enriched and connected by the visual arts.
