### 10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Warrior Canine Connection (WCC) has provided 4,750 Veterans who suffer from Post Traumatic Stress (PTS) and/or Traumatic Brain Injuries (TBI) with a mission to support their fellow Veterans by training mobility service dogs. Harnessing the healing power of the Warrior Ethos and the human-animal bond, WCC's program offers a safe, effective and therapeutic intervention that mitigates symptoms of PTS/TBI and produces well-trained service dogs to be partnered with Veterans with disabilities. Because of WCC's program design, each dog in the program has the ability to participate in the healing of not only one, but up to 60 Veterans, before being placed as a service dog with a Veteran. When we consider the growing number of Veterans diagnosed with PTS/TBI and an alarming suicide rate, it becomes clear that we must invest in new innovative therapies to reverse this trend.

#### 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

In partnership with Montgomery County and the State, WCC is creating a premier center where Veterans and their families can come to heal from the visible and invisible wounds of war. Once renovated, a large barn at the site will provide space for WCC's unique therapeutic service dog training program, as well as critical facilities needed to breed, train and partner future service dogs. In 2014, WCC signed a lease with the MD Department of Natural Resources and immediately began efforts to transform the Schaeffer Farm property. At the inception of the lease, the property was in very poor condition--abandoned with overgrown vegetation and dilapidated structures unsafe for the public to enter. Over 3 years, WCC has invested \$2M in property renovations.

#### 28. Comments

Since 2015, WCC has been working to raise necessary capital construction funds to support the renovation of the Schaeffer Farm property, Maryland State Park property which is leased from the State of Maryland Department of Natural Resources. Total all-time Capital Construction gifts to enhance the property include 1,756 gifts, totaling \$3,477,611 in cash and \$649,637 in gifts in kind of

services and materials. Other unrestricted gifts to the organization also have been used to support property renovations.

As the most significant part of the overall property improvements, WCC is working to renovate a 1938 large dairy barn to serve as the organization's headquarters and training facilities at the Schaeffer Farm property. Current barn size is 12,026 GSF. A total of 8,800 GSF of that space is targeted for renovation; 3,226 GSF will be demolished; and 3,800 GSF of new construction will be added. Within 5 years of completion, WCC anticipates that this critical renovation project will allow the organization to serve 2,047 Veterans and Military Family Members annually, and host more than 1,000 Maryland volunteers at the property. From its national headquarters in Maryland, WCC already served 804 unique Veterans and Military Family Members in 2019, and engaged 1,024 area volunteers in its work. Total served by WCC last year was 1,828.

As Governor Hogan had proclaimed 2019 the Year of the Veteran in Maryland, WCC hopes to gain support from the State of Maryland to realize this premier center of healing. Made possible by federal, state and non-profit partners working together, this center has the opportunity to make a significant impact on the mental health and well-being of the Veterans and their Military Families who call Maryland home.
