10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The YMCA of Metropolitan Washington's mission is to foster the spiritual, mental, and physical development of individuals, families and communities, according to the ideals of inclusiveness, equality and mutual respect for all. The YMCA is one of the largest social service agencies serving Washington D.C., suburban Maryland, and northern Virginia. Each year, we provide opportunities in wellness, aquatics, youth sports, summer camp, childcare, and more for over 250,000 people through our 16 branches and program centers. We provide financial assistance and scholarship programs to ensure our programming is accessible to all. YMCA Bethesda-Chevy Chase has made a difference in Montgomery County for over 75 years, offering a range of health and wellness programs including Fit & Well Seniors, adaptive swimming lessons, youth programming, and other initiatives.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The three-phase, \$30 million capital campaign, "We Build a Better Future Together," will provide a renovation of the 55-year old facility in Bethesda, offering improved programs and services to the community. This project will focus on compliance with the American Disabilities Act and include installing ramps, handles, and an elevator among other improvements. Currently the configuration of our facility is an impediment to serving all youth and families, especially the elderly and those with disabilities. The full range of our programs and services, while available to all, are not accessible to many with physical limitations. The upgrades will focus on ADA compliance because the Y knows that seniors and those with disabilities are seeking a better quality of life and we want to ensure they have access to healthier lifestyles and increased mobility.

28. Comments

YMCA Bethesda-Chevy Chase serves as a community pillar with nearly eight decades of delivering

programs to thousands of residents annually. For Youth Development, our YMCA offers preschool, before and after school care, enrichment programs and summer camps. To encourage Healthy Living, we provide group exercise, swim lessons, water exercise, adaptive swim, senior classes, and tennis programs. Under Social Responsibility, we promote community events and annual fundraisers that support our financial assistance and scholarship programs for those who are experiencing financial difficulties. The YMCA does not turn away anyone for their inability to pay. A confirmation of community involvement, we boast a dynamic 20 volunteer board, which supports efforts of almost 400 program volunteers. In 2018 we granted a generous \$507,836.89 in subsidies and scholarships to 1,798 residents in greater Montgomery County, especially at-risk children, so that they could participate in life-enhancing programs. With support from the state, together, we build a better future, especially to those in dire need of our programs and services offered in an accessible facility.

With the completion of phase one of our renovations, YMCA Bethesda-Chevy Chase has made great strides towards accomplishing ADA compliance, providing greater access to health and wellness programming for seniors and people with disabilities, and aligning our physical structure with our mission of inclusivity. Phase one of construction was completed in July 2019 and included installing one elevator, widening 25 doors for ADA compliance, and updating 4 locker rooms for ADA compliance. While many of our goals have been reached successfully, we did experience challenges in the areas of fundraising and in reaching full ADA accessibility in the locker rooms. 2020 funding from the State of Maryland Bond Bill will help us to close this crucial gap.
