## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Correctional Services - Inmates - Labor, Job Training, and Educational Courses

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the compensation rate for inmate labor in Maryland 4 Correctional Enterprises to be not less than the State minimum wage; repealing a 5 requirement that the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services 6 reimburse a certain county or the State for certain costs from an inmate's earnings 7 under certain circumstances; prohibiting the Department from deducting certain 8 costs from an inmate's earnings; requiring the Division of Correction to offer job 9 training to certain inmates; requiring the Division to partner with labor unions and 10 trade associations to develop certain training programs; requiring certain training 11 to focus on certain skills; requiring the Division to offer educational courses to certain 12 inmates; requiring certain educational courses to include certain types of courses 13 and subjects; requiring the Department to report to the Governor and General Assembly on certain matters on or before a certain date annually; making a 14 15 conforming change; and generally relating to inmates.

26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

27 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:



## 1 Article - Correctional Services

- 3 (a) (1) [The] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE
  4 Commissioner and Chief Executive Officer shall establish the compensation rate for inmate
  5 labor in Maryland Correctional Enterprises, taking into consideration other wage
  6 payments and incentives in other programs.
- 7 (2) THE COMPENSATION RATE FOR INMATE LABOR IN MARYLAND 8 CORRECTIONAL ENTERPRISES MAY NOT BE LESS THAN THE STATE MINIMUM WAGE 9 UNDER § 3–413(C) OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE.
- 10 (b) After review by the Management Council, and after consideration of any recommendation by the Chief Executive Officer, the Commissioner shall adopt regulations in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article that govern the method and time of compensation payments.

- 15 (a) This section applies to an inmate in a State or local correctional facility.
- 16 (b) The Department shall collect an inmate's earnings.
- 17 (c) **(1)** From an inmate's earnings, the Department shall:
- [(1) if required by law, reimburse the county or State for the cost of providing food, lodging, and clothing to the inmate;
- 20 (2) (1) pay court ordered payments for support of dependents;
- [(3)] (II) pay court ordered payments for restitution; and
- [(4)] (III) pay compensation for victims of crime in accordance with subsection (d) of this section.
- 24 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT DEDUCT THE COST OF FOOD, 25 LODGING, OR CLOTHING FROM AN INMATE'S EARNINGS.
- 26 (d) (1) Of the earnings of an inmate in the Private Sector/Prison Industry
  27 Enhancement Certification Program of the United States Department of Justice, Bureau
  28 of Justice Assistance, the Department shall withhold 20% for compensation for victims of
  29 crime, in accordance with the requirements of the Program.

- 1 (2) (i) This paragraph applies to an inmate who is subject to an 2 unsatisfied judgment of restitution.
- 3 (ii) If an inmate has earnings that are not covered under the 4 provisions of paragraph (1) of this subsection, the Department shall withhold 25% for 5 compensation for victims of crime until the judgment is satisfied.
- 6 (3) (i) If a court in a criminal or juvenile delinquency proceeding has 7 ordered the inmate to pay restitution, the Department shall forward the money withheld 8 under paragraph (1) of this subsection to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund 9 established under § 11–819 of the Criminal Procedure Article.
- 10 (ii) The Criminal Injuries Compensation Board shall distribute from 11 the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund any amount received under this paragraph to 12 the person or governmental unit specified in the judgment of restitution to pay the 13 restitution as required under § 11–607(b)(2) of the Criminal Procedure Article.
- 14 (4) If the inmate is not subject to a judgment of restitution or the judgment 15 of restitution is satisfied, of the money withheld under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the 16 Department shall pay:
- 17 (i) 50% into the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund established 18 under § 11–819 of the Criminal Procedure Article; and
- 19 (ii) 50% into the State Victims of Crime Fund established under § 20 11–916 of the Criminal Procedure Article.
- 21 (e) The Department shall:
- 22 (1) credit to the inmate's account any balance that remains after paying 23 the items in subsection (c)(1) [through (4)] of this section; and
- 24 (2) pay the balance in the inmate's account to the inmate within 15 days 25 after the inmate is released.

- 29 (2) THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION SHALL PARTNER WITH LABOR 30 UNIONS AND TRADE ASSOCIATIONS TO DEVELOP THE JOB TRAINING PROGRAMS TO 31 BE OFFERED.
