1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Department of Health – Residential Service Agencies – Training Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of requiring each residential service agency, beginning on a certain date, $\mathbf{5}$ to ensure that certain individuals receive certain training relating to dementia, 6 subject to certain exceptions; providing that certain training may be provided by a 7 certain supervisory staff member; prohibiting providing that a residential service 8 agency from requiring is not required to provide certain individuals to complete 9 certain training under certain circumstances; requiring an individual a person who 10 provides certain training to issue a certification of completion to each individual who 11 completes the training; requiring each residential service agency to maintain certain 12records; requiring certain individuals who have not received certain training to 13 complete certain training on or before a certain date; defining a certain term; 14 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to residential service 15agencies.

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6 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "SUPERVISORY STAFF" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO 7 SUPERVISES DIRECT CARE STAFF IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S CLINICAL ROLE.

8 (B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY 9 THAT ONLY PROVIDES DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT.

10 (C) (1) **BEGINNING** EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS 11 <u>SECTION, BEGINNING</u> JULY 1, 2022, EACH RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY SHALL 12 ENSURE THAT:

28 (II) EACH MEMBER OF THE RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY'S 29 DIRECT CARE OR SUPERVISORY STAFF RECEIVES 2 HOURS OF ONLINE OR 30 IN-PERSON CONTINUING EDUCATION TRAINING REGARDING ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE 31 AND DEMENTIA EACH CALENDAR YEAR. 1 (2) THE TRAINING REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 2 SUBSECTION MAY BE PROVIDED BY A SUPERVISORY STAFF MEMBER WHO IS 3 RESPONSIBLE FOR DEVELOPING AN INDIVIDUAL'S PLAN OF CARE AND ASSIGNING 4 APPROPRIATE PERSONNEL.

(F) EACH RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY SHALL MAINTAIN RECORDS THAT
 INDICATE THE TYPE OF TRAINING RECEIVED BY EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS
 RECEIVED A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION ISSUED UNDER SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS
 SECTION WHILE EMPLOYED BY THE RESIDENTIAL SERVICE AGENCY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That an individual employed as part of a residential service agency's direct care or supervisory staff on October 1, 2021, who has not received training that is equivalent to the training described under § 19–4A–03.1(c)(1) of the Health – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall complete the training required under § 19–4A–03.1(c)(1) of the Health – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, on or before August 15, 2022.

31 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 32 October 1, 2021.
