1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Estates and Trusts - Maryland Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act - Revisions

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a person who chooses to be an organ donor on or after a certain date to designate if the anatomical gift is to be used for certain purposes; 4 5 requiring the Organ Procurement Organization or its designee to produce and 6 provide to each Motor Vehicle Administration location educational materials that 7 include certain information; requiring each Motor Vehicle Administration location to 8 prominently display and make available to prospective donors on request the 9 educational materials; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to adopt 10 regulations to carry out certain provisions of this Act; altering the purposes for which 11 certain anatomical gifts may be used; requiring that a certain gift registered before 12 a certain date be used only for certain purposes; repealing provisions of law that 13 require certain persons to search certain individuals for a document of gift or any other information identifying the individual as a donor, that specify certain 14 procedures to be taken if a document is located, and that concern certain 15 16 administrative sanctions; requiring a certain procurement organization to make a 17 certain search of certain registries under certain circumstances; providing for a 18 delayed effective date; and generally relating to the Maryland Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act. 19

- 1 (2) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, if the individual is the recipient 2 of the part, an individual designated by the person making the anatomical gift; or
- 3 (3) An eye bank or a transplant tissue bank.
- 4 (e) If an anatomical gift of one or more specific parts is made in a document of gift that does not name a person described in subsection (a) of this section and does not identify the purpose of the gift, the gift passes in accordance with subsection (g) of this section [and may be used only for transplantation or therapy].
- 8 (f) (1) # EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION,
  9 IF a document of gift specifies only a general intent to make an anatomical gift by words
  10 such as "donor", "organ donor", or "body donor", or by a symbol or statement of similar
  11 import, the gift passes in accordance with subsection (g) of this section and may be used
  12 [only] for transplantation, RESEARCH, EDUCATION, or therapy.

- 16 (g) For purposes of subsections (b), (e), and (f) of this section, the following 17 provisions apply:
- 18 (1) If the part is an eye, the gift passes to the appropriate eye bank;
- 19 (2) If the part is tissue, the gift passes to the appropriate tissue bank; and
- 20 (3) If the part is an organ, the gift passes to the appropriate organ 21 procurement organization as custodian of the organ.

- 23 (a) The following persons shall make a reasonable search of an individual who 24 the person reasonably believes is dead or whose death is imminent for a document of gift or any other information identifying the individual as a donor or as an individual who made 26 a refusal:
- 27 (1) A law enforcement officer, firefighter, paramedic, or any other 28 emergency rescuer finding the individual; and
- 29 (2) If no other source of the information is immediately available, a 30 hospital, as soon as practical after the individual's arrival at the hospital.
- 31 (b) If a document of gift or a refusal to make an anatomical gift is located by the 32 search required under subsection (a)(1) of this section and the individual or deceased
