A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Queen Anne's County – Alcoholic Beverages – Unannounced Visits by Inspectors**

3 FOR the purpose of decreasing the frequency with which an alcoholic beverages inspector
4 is required to make an unannounced visit to every licensed premises in Queen Anne's
5 County; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Queen Anne's County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

19 27–102.

20 This title applies only in Queen Anne's County.

21 27–205.

1 (a) The Board shall appoint an inspector at not less than \$3,000 annually and
2 with a mileage allowance that the County Commissioners determine.

3 (b) An individual may not qualify or continue service as an inspector if the
4 inspector or any member of the inspector's immediate family has a personal or financial
5 interest, directly or indirectly, in a license, license holder, or premises licensed under this
6 article.

7 (c) An inspector shall:

8 (1) investigate all applicants for a license or transfer of a license;

9 (2) inspect at unannounced times every licensed premises in the county at
10 least once every ~~[60]~~ **180** days;

11 (3) except as provided in subsections (d) and (e) of this section, enforce all
12 alcoholic beverages laws with the same power as a law enforcement officer of the State;

13 (4) investigate all violations of the alcoholic beverages laws and report
14 them to the Board;

15 (5) submit monthly reports in writing to the Board of the inspector's
16 activities, setting forth complaints and listing violations that the inspector observed or that
17 were reported to the inspector; and

18 (6) conduct compliance checks relating to the sale of alcoholic beverages to
19 an individual under the age of 21 years in violation of § 6-304 of this article for every
20 licensed premises in accordance with regulations adopted by the Board.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
22 1, 2021.
