CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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<u>Family Child Care Homes, Large Family Child Care Homes, and</u> Child Care Centers – Early Childhood Screening and Assistance

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to develop certain 5 guidelines for developmental screenings for certain children; requiring, beginning on 6 a certain date, family child care homes, large family child care homes, and certain 7 child care centers to offer to certain parents or guardians evaluations for certain 8 children entering the home or center based on the guidelines; requiring an employee 9 of the home or center to provide certain information and assistance to certain parents 10 or guardians under certain circumstances; requiring the home or center to provide a 11 certain evaluation and certain assistance a certain number of times per year; 12 authorizing a home or center to meet a certain requirement in a certain manner; 13 providing for a certain immunity for certain employees; providing for the application 14 of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to early childhood 15 developmental screenings and assistance.

 3 (B) OF THIS SECTION TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS AT LEAST TWO TIMES EACH
 4 YEAR.
- 5 (2) A FAMILY CHILD CARE HOME OR A LARGE FAMILY CHILD CARE
 6 HOME MAY MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBSECTION BY COMMUNICATING
 7 THE EXISTENCE OF THE SCREENING AND ASSISTANCE DESCRIBED UNDER
 8 SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION THROUGH A PERSONAL MESSAGE TO A PARENT
 9 OR GUARDIAN, INCLUDING THROUGH AN E-MAIL, A TEXT, OR A TELEPHONE CALL.
- 10 (D) EXCEPT FOR ANY WILLFUL OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT ACT, AN EMPLOYEE
 11 WHO OFFERS A SCREENING UNDER THIS SECTION IN GOOD FAITH TO A CHILD IN
 12 ACCORDANCE WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S GUIDELINES IS IMMUNE FROM ANY CIVIL

- 15 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO CHILD CARE CENTERS THAT ARE REQUIRED 16 TO BE LICENSED OR HOLD A LETTER OF COMPLIANCE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.
- 17 (B) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2022, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH

- 31 (3) AN EMPLOYEE OF THE CHILD CARE CENTER SHALL MAKE THE 32 FOLLOWING INFORMATION AVAILABLE TO THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF EACH 33 CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF 3 YEARS AT THE CENTER:

- 1 (I) Information about the Maryland Infants and 2 Toddlers Program; and
- 3 (II) CONTACT INFORMATION FOR THE LOCAL LEAD AGENCY 4 RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE MARYLAND INFANTS AND 5 TODDLERS PROGRAM.
- 6 (4) If a parent or guardian expresses interest in contacting
 7 The local lead agency for the administration of the Maryland Infants
 8 And Toddlers Program, an employee of the child care center shall
 9 Offer assistance in contacting the agency, including arranging for a
 10 Representative of the agency to come to the center to provide
 11 Assistance to the child.
- 12 **(D) (1)** EACH CHILD CARE CENTER SHALL OFFER THE EVALUATION
 13 SCREENING AND ASSISTANCE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION TO
 14 PARENTS AND GUARDIANS AT LEAST TWO TIMES EACH YEAR.
- 15 (2) A CHILD CARE CENTER MAY MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
 16 SUBSECTION BY COMMUNICATING THE EXISTENCE OF THE EVALUATION SCREENING
 17 AND ASSISTANCE DESCRIBED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION IN PLAIN
 18 LANGUAGE IN A MANNER THAT A PARENT OR GUARDIAN IS LIKELY TO SEE THROUGH
 19 A PERSONAL MESSAGE TO A PARENT OR GUARDIAN, INCLUDING THROUGH AN
 20 E-MAIL, A TEXT, OR A TELEPHONE CALL.
- 21 (E) EXCEPT FOR ANY WILLFUL OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT ACT, AN EMPLOYEE
 22 WHO OFFERS AN EVALUATION A SCREENING UNDER THIS SECTION IN GOOD FAITH
 23 TO A CHILD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DEPARTMENT'S GUIDELINES IS IMMUNE
 24 FROM ANY CIVIL LIABILITY THAT MAY ARISE OUT OF THE SCREENING.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 26 1, 2021.
