1 AN ACT concerning

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Division of Consumer Protection - Assisted Living Programs

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain assisted living programs to report certain 4 information, on or before a certain date each year, to the Division of Consumer Protection of the Office of the Attorney General; requiring the Office of Health Care 5 Quality within the Maryland Department of Health to notify the Division of Consumer 6 7 Protection of the appointment of an assisted living program as a resident's 8 representative payee within a certain time after being made aware of the appointment; 9 requiring the Office of Health Care Quality within the Maryland Department of Health to refer an allegation of an unfair, abusive, or deceptive trade practice by an 10 assisted living program to the Division of Consumer Protection under certain 11 12 circumstances and the Office of the Inspector General within the Department; defining a certain term; and generally relating to assisted living programs and the 13 14 Division of Consumer Protection of the Office of the Attorney General.
