1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Division of Consumer Protection – Assisted Living Programs**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain assisted living programs to report certain
4 information, on or before a certain date each year, to the Division of Consumer
5 Protection of the Office of the Attorney General; *requiring the Office of Health Care*
6 *Quality within the Maryland Department of Health to notify the Division of Consumer*
7 *Protection of the appointment of an assisted living program as a resident's*
8 *representative payee within a certain time after being made aware of the appointment;*
9 requiring the Office of Health Care Quality within the Maryland Department of
10 Health to refer an allegation of an unfair, abusive, or deceptive trade practice by an
11 assisted living program to the Division of Consumer Protection ~~under certain~~
12 ~~circumstances~~ and the Office of the Inspector General within the Department;
13 defining a certain term; and generally relating to assisted living programs and the
14 Division of Consumer Protection of the Office of the Attorney General.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **SUBTITLE 4B. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAMS.**

21 **13–4B–01.**

22 (A) IN THIS SECTION, “ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAM” HAS THE MEANING
23 STATED IN § 19–1801 OF THE HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE.

24 (B) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 1 EACH YEAR, EACH ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAM
25 THAT WAS APPOINTED AS A REPRESENTATIVE PAYEE FOR RESIDENTS OF THE
26 ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAM FACILITY AT ANY POINT DURING THE REPORTING
27 PERIOD SHALL REPORT TO THE DIVISION ON THE USE OF:

28 (1) SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS BY RESIDENTS OF THE ASSISTED
29 LIVING PROGRAM FACILITY DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING YEAR; AND

30 (2) OTHER FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUNDS BY
31 RESIDENTS OF THE ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAM FACILITY DURING THE
32 IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING YEAR THAT ARE ALLOCATED FOR THE PURPOSE OF
33 ASSISTING INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE AGED, DISABLED, OR BLIND.

(C) THE OFFICE OF HEALTH CARE QUALITY SHALL NOTIFY THE DIVISION OF THE APPOINTMENT OF AN ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAM AS A RESIDENT'S REPRESENTATIVE PAYEE WITHIN A REASONABLE TIME AFTER BEING MADE AWARE OF THE APPOINTMENT.

Article – Health – General

19–1801.

In this subtitle:

(1) “Assisted living program” means a residential or facility-based program that provides housing and supportive services, supervision, personalized assistance, health-related services, or a combination thereof that meets the needs of individuals who are unable to perform or who need assistance in performing the activities of daily living or instrumental activities of daily living in a way that promotes optimum dignity and independence for the individuals.

(2) “Assisted living program” does not include:

- (i) A nursing home, as defined under § 19–1401 of this title;
- (ii) A State facility, as defined under § 10–101 of this article;
- (iii) A program licensed by the Department under Title 7 or Title 10 of this article;
- (iv) A hospice care program regulated by the Department under Subtitle 9 of this title;
- (v) Services provided by family members;
- (vi) Services provided in an individual’s own home; or
- (vii) A program certified by the Department of Human Services under Title 6, Subtitle 5, Part II of the Human Services Article as a certified Adult Residential Environment Program.

~~THE OFFICE OF HEALTH CARE QUALITY WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, WHEN REFERRING SHALL REFER AN ALLEGATION OF AN UNFAIR, ABUSIVE, OR DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICE BY AN ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAM TO THE OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, SHALL CONCURRENTLY REFER THE ALLEGATION TO THE DIVISION OF CONSUMER PROTECTION OF THE OFFICE OF~~
