FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Department of Health, on or before a certain 3 4 date, to develop and publish materials to assist State residents with long-term care $\mathbf{5}$ family planning; requiring certain materials to meet certain requirements, be 6 consistent with certain other materials, and include certain contact information; 7 requiring the Department to make certain materials available in certain languages; 8 requiring the Department to ensure that certain materials are understandable to 9 individuals with limited literacy skills; requiring, on or before a certain date, certain 10 State agencies to update certain websites in a certain manner; providing for a 11 delayed effective date; and generally relating to long-term care planning.

- 5 (1) the Maryland Health Care Commission;
- 6 (2) the Department of Disabilities; and
- 7 (3) the Department of Aging.

8 (b) The websites the Department of Aging is required to update under subsection 9 (a) of this section includes the Maryland Access Point website.
