- 1 (c) (1) Unless the driver of the motor vehicle received a citation from a police 2 officer at the time of the violation, the owner or, in accordance with subsection (f)(4) of this 3 section, the driver of a motor vehicle is subject to a civil penalty if the motor vehicle is 4 recorded by a speed monitoring system while being operated in violation of this subtitle.
- 5 (2) A civil penalty under this subsection may not exceed \$40.
- 6 (3) For purposes of this section, the District Court shall prescribe:
- 7 (i) A uniform citation form consistent with subsection (d)(1) of this 8 section and § 7–302 of the Courts Article; and
- 9 (ii) A civil penalty, which shall be indicated on the citation, to be paid 10 by persons who choose to prepay the civil penalty without appearing in District Court.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
