

The Board: 21(g) 22(1) May accept any gift or grant from any person for the Fund; 23Shall use any gift or grant that it receives for the reasons stated under (2)subsection (b) of this section; and 2425(3)Shall deposit any gift or grant that it receives for the Fund with the 26State Treasurer. 27(h) The Fund consists of:

Money appropriated under § 24–1109 of this subtitle;

1 (2) Gifts or grants received by the Board for the Fund; 2 Investment earnings of the Fund; and (3) 3 **(4)** Any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit of the Fund. 4 5 (i) The Fund may be used only for: 6 (1) Providing stipends to corps participants; 7 (2)Providing scholarships to corps participants who have completed the 8 Program to be used at institutions of higher education in the State toward vocational certificates, associate's degrees, and bachelor's degrees; 9 Covering expenses incurred by the Board, including expenses incurred 10 11 during the development, issuance, awarding, and funding of the RFP; and 12 Covering expenses incurred by the operator selected under § 24–1105 **(4)** 13 of this subtitle, as determined by the Board to be relevant to the successful operation of the 14 Program. 15 (j) Any unspent portion of the Fund may not be transferred or revert to the 16 General Fund of the State but shall remain in the Fund to be used for the purposes specified 17 in this subtitle. 18 (k) Beginning with fiscal year 2018, at the end of the fiscal year, the Board (1)shall prepare an annual report of the Fund that includes an accounting of all financial 19 20 receipts and expenditures to and from the Fund. 21(2)The Board shall submit a copy of the report to the General Assembly in 22accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article. 23(1)The Fund may be subject to an audit by the Legislative Auditor. 24-1109. 2425For fiscal year 2018, funds for the Program shall be as provided in the State 26 budget for the Board to develop, issue, and award the RFP described under § 24–1105 of this subtitle. 27 28(b) For fiscal year 2019, funds for the Program shall be as provided in the State 29 budget for the Board to disburse stipends to corps participants and to cover any 30 administrative or other costs incurred by the Board or operator selected under § 24–1105 31 of this subtitle to operationalize the Program.

- 7 (II) GIVES PRIORITY IN RECRUITING CORPS PARTICIPANTS TO

- 9 1. SERVED OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES IN THE PEACE
- 10 CORPS OR ONE OF THE FOLLOWING FEDERAL PROGRAMS:
- 11 A. THE J. WILLIAM FULBRIGHT EDUCATIONAL
- 12 **EXCHANGE PROGRAM**;
- 13 B. THE NATIONAL SERVICE TRUST PROGRAM;
- 14 C. THE NATIONAL CIVILIAN COMMUNITY CORPS
- 15 PROGRAM; OR
- 16 D. THE AMERICORPS VOLUNTEERS IN SERVICE TO
- 17 AMERICA (VISTA) PROGRAM; AND
- 2. ENDED THEIR TERMS OF SERVICE EARLY, OR
- 19 RETURNED TO THE UNITED STATES BEFORE THE END OF THEIR TERMS OF SERVICE.
- 20 DUE TO THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 22 (a) If funding becomes available from the federal government as part of the
- 23 development of a national contact tracing and COVID-19 public health workforce program,
- 24 it is the intent of the General Assembly that the funding be deposited in the Maryland
- 25 Corps Program Fund established under § 24–1108 of the Education Article.
- 26 (b) Within 30 days after receiving any funding from the federal government as
- 27 provided in subsection (a) of this section, the Governor shall report to the General
- 28 Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, on the Governor's
- 29 plans to utilize that funding.
- 30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 31 1, 2021.
