1 AN ACT concerning

2 Higher Education – Hunger–Free Campus Grant Program – Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Hunger–Free Campus Grant Program; stating the 4 purposes of the Program; requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to $\mathbf{5}$ administer the Program, develop a certain form, and designate certain campuses at 6 certain public institutions of higher education or regional higher education centers 7 as hunger-free campuses using certain criteria; authorizing certain public 8 institutions of higher education to develop certain procedures; requiring certain 9 public institutions of higher education to make certain information publicly 10 available; requiring the Governor, beginning in a certain fiscal year, to include in the 11 annual budget bill a certain appropriation for the Program; requiring the 12 Commission to allocate grant funding to certain public institutions of higher 13education or regional higher education centers; requiring the Commission to 14 determine the amount of grant funding to each eligible public institution of higher 15education or regional higher education center; requiring the Commission to include 16 a certain plan in a certain strategic plan; requiring the Commission to adopt certain 17regulations to carry out the requirements of this Act; requiring the Commission to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on the implementation of this Act 18 19 within a certain time period; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the 20Hunger–Free Campus Grant Program.

12 (B) THE COMMISSION SHALL DESIGNATE AS A HUNGER-FREE CAMPUS ANY 13 CAMPUS OF A 2-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT MEETS 14 ALL OF THE REQUIREMENTS FOR 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER 15 EDUCATION <u>OR REGIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION CENTERS</u> IDENTIFIED IN 16 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE REQUIREMENTS IN 17 SUBSECTION (A) (4) AND (7) OF THIS SECTION.
