A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Local Health Departments - Funding

3 FOR the purpose of specifying the amount of funding required to be included in the State 4 budget for local health services for certain fiscal years; altering the purposes for 5 which local health department funding may be used; prohibiting certain State 6 funding to a subdivision for local health services from being less than the subdivision 7 received in a certain fiscal year; repealing obsolete provisions of law; requiring the 8 Maryland Department of Health to conduct a certain evaluation regarding local 9 health departments on or before a certain date; requiring the Department to consult with certain entities when conducting the evaluation; requiring the Department to 10 11 submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before 12 a certain date; defining a certain term; and generally relating to local health 13 departments.

- The Governor shall include in the State budget, beginning with fiscal year 1997, at a minimum, sufficient funds for local health services as required by this subtitle.

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- 5 (a) The funding required in the State budget for local health services, exclusive of special fund and federal appropriations, shall be at least the amount set forth in subsection 7 (b) of this section.

- 10 (3) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024, \$80,000,000, TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO
 11 EACH MUNICIPALITY OR SUBDIVISION IN THE SAME PROPORTION AS THE FISCAL

- (c) For fiscal year [2013] **2025** and each subsequent fiscal year, no subdivision may receive less State funding for local health services under this section than that subdivision received in fiscal year [2012] **2024**.
- 30 (d) The Secretary shall, in consultation with local health department directors, 31 adopt regulations to guide the distribution of the funding required under this section. The 32 regulations shall give consideration to appropriate measures of community health need, 33 local funding effort, and other relevant factors.

- As to appropriations required by this subtitle, a local match shall be required as a condition of any distribution to a subdivision; however, the local match percentage required by the Secretary of Health may not exceed the local match percentage required for the subdivision for fiscal year 1996.

- The appropriations described in this subtitle shall be used for programs, including related administrative expenses, directed at the following:
- 9 (1) Communicable disease control services;
- 10 (2) Environmental health services;
- 11 (3) Family planning services;
- 12 (4) Maternal and child health services;

- 14 (6) Adult health and geriatric services; [and]
- 15 (7) DATA MANAGEMENT AND EXCHANGE SERVICES REGARDING COMMUNICABLE DISEASES AND OTHER HEALTH MATTERS, AS ALLOWED UNDER

- 29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That:

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1 In this section, "Department" means the Maryland Department of Health. (a) 2 On or before December 1, 2021, the Department shall conduct an evaluation 3 and assessment of the technology, communications, and information services: 4 (1) used by local health departments: made available by the Department; and 5 (2) 6 shared or coordinated through local health departments. (3)7 In conducting the evaluation under subsection (b) of this section, the Department shall consult with: 8 9 the Department of Information Technology; (1) 10 (2) the Maryland Association of Counties; 11 local health departments; and (3)stakeholders who provide or receive services through a local health 12 **(4)** department. 13 14 (d) (1)The Department shall prepare a report of its findings and 15 recommendations regarding: 16 the current capacity of local health departments to effectively (i) 17 maintain, share, and analyze data regarding communicable diseases, medical and health trends, and other information relevant to guarding and treating the public health of 18 19 Maryland residents; and 20 recommendations to enhance local health department services (ii) 21through: 22 1. major projects or technology initiatives; 23 2. improvements to internal processes for procurement of technology; 24253. noncentralized hardware or software upgrades; and 26 4. best practices used by other public health units of 27 government. On or before December 15, 2021, the Department shall submit the 28

report required under paragraph (1) of this subsection to the Senate Budget and Taxation
