  14 Advisory Council, THE MARYLAND OFFICE OF MINORITY HEALTH AND HEALTH
  15 DISPARITIES, AND THE COMMISSION ON CLIMATE CHANGE on recommendations
  16 related to environmental justice and sustainable communities; AND

  18 experiencing environmental justice issues] AFTER SEEKING SEEK INPUT FROM AND
