FOR the purpose of requiring the Executive Director of the Alcohol and Tobacco  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Commission to be a sworn police officer with certain powers; specifying that the 7 Executive Director is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System as 8 a condition of employment; providing that an individual who commences 9 employment as the Executive Director of the State Retirement Agency on or after a certain date shall have immediate vesting rights in the Employees' Pension System; 10 requiring the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System to 11 12transfer certain service earned under certain circumstances; requiring the Board of 13 Trustees to transfer certain employer and member contributions from the 14Employees' Pension System to the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; 15requiring the State Retirement Agency to submit a certain report on or before a certain

16 (A) An individual who is a secretary of a principal department or a head of a 17 department, office, or other unit of the State government serving at the Governor's pleasure 18 has immediate vesting rights on taking office in the State system in which the individual 19 is a member.

### 20 (B) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO COMMENCES EMPLOYMENT AS THE EXECUTIVE 21 DIRECTOR OF THE STATE RETIREMENT AGENCY ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2021, 22 SHALL HAVE IMMEDIATE VESTING RIGHTS IN THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM.

(b) The Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall
transfer any service earned by an individual described under subsection (a) of this section
in the Employees' Pension System from December 1, 2020, through May 31, 2021, to the
Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.

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1 (c) For service credit transferred under subsection (b) of this section, the Board 2 of Trustees shall transfer:

3 (1) to the accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension 4 System the employer contributions that were made to the Employees' Pension System, plus 5 the interest earned on those contributions; and

6 (2) the member contributions from the annuity savings fund of the 7 Employees' Pension System to the annuity savings fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' 8 Pension System.

14 (2) positions ineligible for immediate vesting as a secretary of a principal 15 department or a head of a department, office, or other unit of the State government, and the 16 reasons a position is ineligible.
