1 AN ACT concerning

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Historically Black Colleges and Universities – Funding

FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission to establish a
certain new unit to assist in evaluating and reviewing certain proposals for new
programs and substantial modifications of existing programs by an institution of
postsecondary education; requiring the Governor, beginning in a certain fiscal year,
to include in the annual budget bill an amount sufficient to employ certain staff;
requiring the Governor, in certain fiscal years, to include in the annual budget bill
certain funds for certain historically black colleges and universities in the State;

9 (2) enhancing the economic competitiveness of the State by ensuring the 10 responsiveness of institutions of higher education to market demand; and

11

(3) effectively supporting the State's workforce development requirements.

12 (b) <u>The Maryland Higher Education Commission shall provide any information</u> 13 <u>requested by the Department of Legislative Services or the consultant conducting the study</u> 14 <u>under subsection (a) of this section in a timely manner.</u>

15 (b) (c) (1) On or before December 1, 2021, the Commission Department of Legislative 16 <u>Services</u> shall submit a <u>an interim</u> report on its findings to the Governor and, in accordance 17 with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the President of the Senate and the Speaker 18 of the House that summarizes the <u>results</u> <u>progress</u> of the study conducted in accordance 19 with subsection (a) of this section.

(2) On or before September 1, 2022, the Department of Legislative Services
 shall submit a final report on its findings to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257
 of the State Government Article, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
 that summarizes the results of the study conducted in accordance with subsection (a) of this
 section.

25 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

(a) The State's historically black colleges and universities, Bowie State
University, Coppin State University, Morgan State University, and University of Maryland
Eastern Shore, are encouraged to hire a consultant who would assist the institutions, as a
collective, with programmatic development.

30 (b) On or before December 1, 2021, each institution shall submit a report on its 31 efforts and any findings to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State 32 Government Article, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House that 33 summarizes the steps taken to comply with subsection (a) of this section.

34 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State's historically black 35 colleges and universities, Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Morgan State 36 University, and University of Maryland Eastern Shore, are encouraged to use funds 37 provided by this Act to support and implement the Blueprint for Maryland's Future.

1 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

2 (a) Section 1 of this Act is contingent on the execution of a final settlement 3 agreement in the case of The Coalition for Equity and Excellence in Maryland Higher 4 Education v. Maryland Higher Education Commission, 06–CV–02773–CCB (D. MD) on or 5 before June 1, 2021, that:

6 (1) incorporates and does not exceed the financial and programmatic 7 commitments contained in Section 1 of this Act;

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(2) incorporates the order described in subsection (d)(2) of this section; and

9 (3) provides for attorney's fees and expenses in an amount not less than 10 \$14,000,000 but not more than \$25,000,000 to plaintiffs' counsel in The Coalition for Equity 11 and Excellence in Maryland Higher Education v. Maryland Higher Education Commission, 12 06–CV–02773–CCB (D. MD).

13 (b) (1) In fiscal year 2023, the Governor shall provide an allocation for the 14 attorney's fees and expenses in the amount specified in the final settlement agreement 15 described in subsection (a) of this section.

16 (2) The amount allocated under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be 17 provided from the funds for the historically black colleges and universities under Section 1 18 of this Act, with the amounts allocated based on each institution's share of the total funds 19 provided under Section 1 of this Act.

(3) Notwithstanding § 12–501 of the State Government Article or any other
provision of law, the settlement agreement as provided in subsection (a) of this section,
including attorney's fees and expenses provided in the settlement agreement, are not
subject to approval by the Board of Public Works.

24 (c) The Attorney General:

(1) is authorized to execute the final settlement agreement in subsection
(a) of this section on behalf of the State on terms the Attorney General deems:

(i) as final resolution of the case of The Coalition for Equity and
Excellence in Maryland Higher Education v. the Maryland Higher Education Commission,
06-CV-02773-CCB (D. MD); and

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(ii) appropriate to carry out the purposes of Section 1 of this Act; and

31 (2) shall provide written notice of the executed settlement agreement to the
 32 Department of Legislative Services, 90 State Circle, Annapolis, MD 21401.

1 (d) Section 1 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, 2 shall be null and void if, on or before June 11, 2021:

3 (1) the Department of Legislative Services has not received notice of the 4 settlement agreement; and

5 (2) an order has not been issued from the United States District Court for 6 the District of Maryland or the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit that:

7 (i) reverses or vacates the District Court's holding that the State 8 failed to eliminate traceable de jure era policy of unnecessary program duplication; or

9 (ii) holds that any policy of unnecessary program duplication 10 traceable to de jure segregation has been cured by the terms of the settlement agreement.

11 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section 12 6 of this Act, this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation 13 of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by 14 three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, 15 and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
