## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning 1

### 2 State Procurement - Small Business Reserve Program

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the minimum percentage of a unit's total dollar value of 4 contracts that is, to the extent practicable, to be made directly to small businesses; 5 providing that certain preferences do not apply to certain procurement contracts; 6 requiring a certain unit to apply a certain percentage price preference on certain 7 procurement contracts under certain circumstances; providing for the application of 8 this Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Small Business 9 Reserve Program.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 15
- That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 16

#### Article - State Finance and Procurement 17

- 18 14-501.
- 19 In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. (a)
- 20 (B) "PERCENTAGE PRICE PREFERENCE" MEANS THE PERCENTAGE BY
- 21 WHICH A RESPONSIVE BID OR OFFER FROM A RESPONSIBLE BIDDER OR OFFEROR
- 22 THAT IS A RESIDENT SMALL BUSINESS MAY EXCEED THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE BID
- 23 OR OFFER SUBMITTED BY A RESPONSIBLE BIDDER OR OFFEROR THAT IS A

## 1 NONRESIDENT SMALL BUSINESS.

- 2 (C) (1) "PRINCIPAL OFFICE" MEANS A PRIMARY PLACE OF BUSINESS
  3 THAT IS STAFFED ON A REGULAR BASIS TO PROVIDE THE GOODS OR SERVICES THAT
  4 ARE REQUESTED BY A UNIT IN A SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE PROCUREMENT.
- 5 (2) "PRINCIPAL OFFICE" DOES NOT INCLUDE A SATELLITE OFFICE OR
  6 AN OFFICE THAT IS MINIMALLY STAFFED AND IS NOT OPEN ON A REGULAR BASIS TO
  7 PROVIDE THE SERVICES THAT ARE REQUESTED BY A UNIT IN A SMALL BUSINESS
  8 RESERVE PROCUREMENT.
- 9 **(D)** "RESIDENT SMALL BUSINESS" MEANS A SMALL BUSINESS WHOSE 10 PRINCIPAL OFFICE IS LOCATED IN THE STATE.
- 11 [(b)] (E) "Small business" means:
- 12 (1) a certified minority business enterprise, as defined in § 14–301 of this 13 title, that meets the criteria specified under item (2) of this subsection; or
- 14 (2) a business, other than a broker, that meets the following criteria:
- 15 (i) the business is independently owned and operated;
- 16 (ii) the business is not a subsidiary of another business;
- 17 (iii) the business is not dominant in its field of operation; and
- 18 (iv) 1. A. the wholesale operations of the business did not 19 employ more than 50 persons in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- B. the retail operations of the business did not employ more than 25 persons in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- C. the manufacturing operations of the business did not employ more than 100 persons in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- D. the service operations of the business did not employ more than 100 persons in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- E. the construction operations of the business did not employ more than 50 persons in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years; and
- F. the architectural and engineering services of the business did not employ more than 100 persons in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years; or
- 30 2. A. the gross sales of the wholesale operations of the

- business did not exceed an average of \$4,000,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- B. the gross sales of the retail operations of the business did not exceed an average of \$3,000,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- C. the gross sales of the manufacturing operations of the business did not exceed an average of \$2,000,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- B. the gross sales of the service operations of the business did not exceed an average of \$10,000,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years;
- E. the gross sales of the construction operations of the business did not exceed an average of \$7,000,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years; and
- F. the gross sales of the architectural and engineering services of the business did not exceed an average of \$4,500,000 in its most recently completed 3 fiscal years.
- 16 **[(c)] (F)** "Small business reserve" means those procurements that are limited to responses from small businesses under § 14–502(b) of this subtitle.
- 18 14-502.
- 19 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, this subtitle applies to all 20 procurements by a unit.
- 21 (b) This subsection does not apply to procurements subject to Subtitle 1 of this 22 title.
- 23 (c) To the extent practicable, a unit shall structure its procurement procedures to achieve a minimum of [15%] **25**% of the unit's total dollar value of goods, supplies, services, maintenance, construction, construction—related services, and architectural and engineering service contracts to be made directly to small businesses.
- 27 (d) The total dollar value of procurements by a unit does not include the value of 28 contracts to which this section does not apply because of a conflict with federal law.
- 29 (e) A unit may apply toward the unit's overall annual Small Business Reserve 30 payment achievement only those payments resulting from a procurement that is 31 designated a Small Business Reserve procurement.
- 32 (f) The Special Secretary for the Office of Small, Minority, and Women Business 33 Affairs, in consultation with the Attorney General, shall establish standards and guidelines 34 for participation in the Small Business Reserve Program every 5 years.

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- 2 (a) THE PROVISIONS OF §§ 14–401 AND 14–401.1 OF THIS TITLE DO NOT 3 APPLY TO A PROCUREMENT DESIGNATED FOR THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE 4 UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 5 **(B)** Any procurement by a unit of goods, supplies, services, maintenance, construction, construction—related services, architectural services, and engineering services shall be eligible for designation for the small business reserve.
- 8 [(b)] (C) A solicitation for procurement that has been designated for a small 9 business reserve shall be published in the same manner as required for an invitation for 10 bids as set forth in § 13–103(c) of this article.
- 11 [(c)] (D) The procurement officer of a unit shall, SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (E)
  12 OF THIS SECTION, award a procurement contract designated for a small business reserve
  13 to the small business that submits a responsive bid that:
- 14 (1) is the lowest bid price;
- 15 (2) if the invitation for bids so provides, is the lowest evaluated bid price; 16 or
- 17 (3) is the bid or proposal most favorable to the State within the small 18 business reserve.
- 19 (E) A UNIT SHALL APPLY A PERCENTAGE PRICE PREFERENCE OF 5% TO 20 RESIDENT SMALL BUSINESSES ON PROCUREMENT CONTRACTS DESIGNATED FOR 21 THE SMALL BUSINESS RESERVE, PROVIDED THAT:
- 22 (1) IF SUBSECTION (D)(3) OF THIS SECTION IS THE BASIS FOR AWARD,
  23 THE BID OR OFFER SUBMITTED BY THE RESIDENT SMALL BUSINESS IS DETERMINED
  24 TO BE THE BID OR PROPOSAL MOST FAVORABLE TO THE STATE WITHIN THE SMALL
  25 BUSINESS RESERVE; AND
- 26 (2) THE PREFERENCE DOES NOT CONFLICT WITH A FEDERAL LAW OR 27 GRANT AFFECTING THE PROCUREMENT CONTRACT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any procurement under the Small Business Reserve Program advertised to the public before the effective date of this Act.
  - SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

1 October 1, 2021.
