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Maryland Medical Assistance Program – Doulas <u>Doula Pilot Program</u>

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, subject to certain limitations, to provide certified doula services; authorizing the Secretary of Health 4 to contract with certified doulas for the provision of care under the Maryland Medical 5 6 Assistance Program; providing that certified doulas need not be under the 7 supervision of a physician for purposes of certain provisions of this Act; defining a 8 certain term; establishing the Maryland Medical Assistance Program Doula Pilot 9 Program; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to administer the Pilot 10 Program; providing for the purpose of the Pilot Program; requiring the Department to take certain actions in administering the Pilot Program; requiring the Department 11 12 to submit a certain report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before certain dates; defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and 13 generally relating to the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and doulas Doula 14 Pilot Program. 15
