BY adding to Article – Health – General Section 19–1805(c) Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health - General 19–1805.
