State and Local Procurement - Payment Practices

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering a State policy regarding the payment of certain funds after 4 receipt of a proper invoice; requiring each county and municipality to adopt a certain 5 policy; reducing the number of days following receipt of an invoice after which the 6 State owes interest on unpaid amounts and interest begins to accrue on unpaid 7 amounts; repealing a requirement that a contractor submit an invoice within a 8 certain amount of time in order to receive interest payments; and generally relating to the payment practices of the State and local governments for amounts owed under 9 10 procurement contracts.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 1 It is the policy of the State to make a payment under a procurement contract within 2 [30] **15** days: 3 after the day on which the payment becomes due under the (1) 4 procurement contract; or (2)5 if later, after the day on which the unit receives an invoice. 6 15-104.7 Except as provided in § 15–105 of this subtitle, interest shall accrue at the 8 rate of 9% per annum on any amount that: 9 (1) is due and payable by law and under the written procurement contract; 10 and remains unpaid more than [45] 15 days after a unit receives an invoice. 11 (2)12 (b) Interest shall accrue beginning on the [31st] **16TH** day after: 13 (1) the day on which payment becomes due under a procurement contract; 14 or15 (2) if later, the day on which the unit receives an invoice. 16 15-105.17 A unit is not liable under § 15–104 of this subtitle for interest: 18 unless within 30 days after the date on the State's check for the amount on which the interest accrued, the contractor submits an invoice for the interest; 19 20 (2)] **(1)** if a contract claim has been filed under Subtitle 2 of this title; 21accruing more than 1 year after the [31st] 16TH day after the [(3)] **(2)** 22unit receives an invoice; or 23[(4)] (3) on an amount that represents unpaid interest. - NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, EACH COUNTY AND MUNICIPALITY
 SHALL ADOPT THE POLICY ESTABLISHED UNDER § 15–103 OF THE STATE FINANCE
 AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE WITH REGARD TO PAYMENT FOR GOODS AND

1 SERVICES PROCURED BY THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY.

- 3 October 1, 2021.
