CHAPTER
AN ACT concerning
Community Colleges Institutions of Higher Education – State Funding – Revision
FOR the purpose of requiring the University of Maryland School of Medicine to provide certain clinical care at the University of Maryland Capital Region Medical Center and certain rural hospitals by assigning certain faculty to the Center and certain rural hospitals who specialize in certain areas; requiring the Governor, for certain fiscal years, to include in the annual budget bill an appropriation to implement certain requirements regarding the provision of certain clinical care; providing that a certain appropriation calculated under the Senator John A. Cade Funding Formula and, a certain appropriation for Baltimore City Community College, and a certain appropriation for certain private nonprofit institutions of higher education include appropriations, regardless of where they are budgeted, designated for the general
