## Income Tax Distribution - Tax Clinics for Low-Income Marylanders

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that each fiscal year, for certain fiscal years, the Comptroller 4 to distribute a certain amount of income tax revenue from individuals certain abandoned property funds to the Tax Clinics for Low-Income Marylanders Fund; 5 establishing the Tax Clinics for Low-Income Marylanders Fund as a special, 6 7 nonlapsing fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the Secretary of 8 Higher Education Comptroller to administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer 9 to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; authorizing the Governor to include in the annual budget bill an appropriation to the Fund beginning 10 in a certain fiscal year; specifying the contents of the Fund; specifying the purpose 11 12 for which the Fund may be used; providing for the investment of money in and expenditures from the Fund; making stylistic changes and a conforming change; 13 14 defining a certain term; providing for the termination of certain provisions of this Act;
