## Law Enforcement – Body–Worn Cameras – Capabilities

- FOR the purpose of requiring a certain policy developed and published by the Maryland
  Police Training and Standards Commission to require that a body-worn camera
  purchased or otherwise procured for use by a law enforcement officer on or after a
  certain date have certain capabilities; repealing a certain obsolete reference; and
  generally relating to law enforcement officers and body-worn cameras.

17 (A) [On or before January 1, 2016, the] **THE** Maryland Police Training and 18 Standards Commission shall develop and publish online a policy for the issuance and use 19 of a body-worn camera by a law enforcement officer that addresses:

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(1) the testing of body–worn cameras to ensure adequate functioning;
