- 7 (2) any show cause order for contempt for failure to appear in court for an 8 examination in aid of enforcement of a money judgment entered in a small claim action in 9 the District Court on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
