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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Courts of Appeals and Special Appeals – Renaming**

3 FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to change the  
4 name of the Court of Appeals to be the Supreme Court of Maryland, to change the  
5 name of the Court of Special Appeals to be the Appellate Court of Maryland, to  
6 change the name of a Judge of the Court of Appeals to be a Justice of the Supreme  
7 Court of Maryland, and to change the name of the Chief Judge of the Court of  
8 Appeals to be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Maryland; providing that  
9 the Supreme Court of Maryland is the successor to the Court of Appeals; providing  
10 that the Appellate Court of Maryland is the successor to the Court of Special Appeals;  
11 providing that a Justice of the Supreme Court of Maryland is the successor to a Judge  
12 of the Court of Appeals; providing that the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of  
13 Maryland is the successor to the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals; providing that  
14 the Chief Judge of the Appellate Court of Maryland is the successor to the Chief  
15 Judge of the Court of Special Appeals; providing that a Judge of the Appellate Court  
16 of Maryland is the successor to a Judge of the Court of Special Appeals; providing  
17 that the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Maryland is the successor the Clerk of the  
18 Court of Appeals; providing that the Clerk of the Appellate Court of Maryland is the  
19 successor to the Clerk of the Court of Special Appeals; providing that certain names  
20 and titles of a certain unit and officials in laws and other documents mean the names  
21 and titles of the successor unit and officials; providing for the continuity of certain  
22 matters and persons; providing that letterhead, business cards, and other documents  
23 reflecting the renaming of the Court of Appeals, the Court of Special Appeals, a  
24 Judge of the Court of Appeals, and the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals may not  
25 be used until all letterhead, business cards, and other documents already in print

30 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
 31 (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses concurring), That it be  
 32 proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

### 33 Article II – Executive Department

34 6.

35 (a) If the Governor-elect is disqualified, resigns, or dies, the Lieutenant  
 36 Governor-elect shall become Governor for the full term. If the Governor-elect fails to  
 37 assume office for any other reason, the newly elected Lieutenant Governor shall become  
 38 Lieutenant Governor and shall serve as acting Governor until the Governor-elect assumes

1 office or until the office becomes vacant.

2 (b) The Lieutenant Governor shall serve as acting Governor when notified in  
3 writing by the Governor that the Governor will be temporarily unable to perform the duties  
4 of [his] **THE GOVERNOR'S** office. The Lieutenant Governor also shall serve as acting  
5 Governor when the Governor is disabled but is unable to communicate to the Lieutenant  
6 Governor the fact of [his] **THE GOVERNOR'S** inability to perform the duties of [his] **THE**  
7 **GOVERNOR'S** office. In either event the Lieutenant Governor shall serve as acting  
8 Governor until notified in writing by the Governor that [he] **THE GOVERNOR** is able to  
9 resume the duties of [his] **THE GOVERNOR'S** office or until the office becomes vacant.

10 (c) The General Assembly, by the affirmative vote of three-fifths of all its  
11 members in joint session, may adopt a resolution declaring that the Governor or Lieutenant  
12 Governor is unable by reason of physical or mental disability to perform the duties of [his]  
13 **THE** office. When action is undertaken pursuant to this subsection of the Constitution, the  
14 officer who concludes that the other officer is unable, by reason of disability to perform the  
15 duties of [his] **THE** office shall have the power to call the General Assembly into Joint  
16 Session. The resolution, if adopted, shall be delivered to the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME**  
17 **COURT OF MARYLAND**, which then shall have exclusive jurisdiction to determine whether  
18 that officer is unable by reason of the disability to perform the duties of [his] **THE** office. If  
19 the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** determines that such officer is  
20 unable to discharge the duties of [his] **THE** office by reason of a permanent disability, the  
21 office shall be vacant. If the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**  
22 determines that such officer is unable to discharge the duties of [his] **THE** office by reason  
23 of a temporary disability, it shall declare the office to be vacant during the time of the  
24 disability and the Court shall have continuing jurisdiction to determine when the disability  
25 has terminated. If the General Assembly and the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT**  
26 **OF MARYLAND**, acting in the same manner as described above, determine that the  
27 Governor-elect or Lieutenant Governor-elect is unable by reason of physical or mental  
28 disability to perform the duties of the **ELECTED** office [to which he has been elected], [he]  
29 **THE ELECTED OFFICER** shall be disqualified to assume office.

30 (d) When a vacancy occurs in the office of Governor, the Lieutenant Governor  
31 shall succeed to that office for the remainder of the term. When a vacancy occurs in the  
32 office of Lieutenant Governor, the Governor shall nominate a person who shall succeed to  
33 that office upon confirmation by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the  
34 General Assembly in joint session.

35 (e) If vacancies in the offices of Governor and Lieutenant Governor exist at the  
36 same time, the General Assembly shall convene forthwith, and the office of Governor shall  
37 be filled for the remainder of the term by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members  
38 of the General Assembly in joint session. The person so chosen as Governor by the General  
39 Assembly shall then nominate a person to succeed to the office of Lieutenant Governor,  
40 upon confirmation by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the General  
41 Assembly in the same joint session. The President of the Senate shall serve as acting

1 Governor until the newly elected Governor has qualified. If a vacancy exists in the office of  
2 Lieutenant Governor, at a time when the Lieutenant Governor is authorized to serve as  
3 acting Governor, the President of the Senate shall serve as acting Governor. If there is a  
4 vacancy in the office of the President of the Senate at a time when [he] **THE PRESIDENT**  
5 is authorized to serve as acting Governor, the Senate shall forthwith convene and fill the  
6 vacancy.

7 (f) When the Lieutenant Governor or a person elected by the General Assembly  
8 succeeds to the office of Governor, [he] **THE PERSON WHO SUCCEEDS TO THE OFFICE**  
9 shall have the title, powers, duties, and emoluments of that office; but when the Lieutenant  
10 Governor or the President of the Senate serves as acting Governor, [he] **THE ACTING**  
11 **GOVERNOR** shall have only the powers and duties of that office. When the President of the  
12 Senate serves as acting Governor, [he] **THE PRESIDENT** shall continue to be President of  
13 the Senate, but [his] **THE PRESIDENT'S** duties as president shall be performed by such  
14 other person as the Senate shall select.

15 (g) The [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall have  
16 original and exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate disputes or questions arising from the  
17 failure of the Governor-elect to take office, or the service of the Lieutenant Governor or  
18 President of the Senate as acting Governor, or the creation of a vacancy in the office of  
19 Governor or Lieutenant Governor by reason of disability, or the succession to the office of  
20 Governor or Lieutenant Governor, or the exercise of the powers and duties of a successor to  
21 the office of Governor.

### 22 **Article III – Legislative Department**

23 5.

24 Following each decennial census of the United States and after public hearings, the  
25 Governor shall prepare a plan setting forth the boundaries of the legislative districts for  
26 electing of the members of the Senate and the House of Delegates.

27 The Governor shall present the plan to the President of the Senate and Speaker of  
28 the House of Delegates who shall introduce the Governor's plan as a joint resolution to the  
29 General Assembly, not later than the first day of its regular session in the second year  
30 following every census, and the Governor may call a special session for the presentation of  
31 [his] **THE** plan prior to the regular session. The plan shall conform to Sections 2, 3 and 4 of  
32 this Article. Following each decennial census the General Assembly may by joint resolution  
33 adopt a plan setting forth the boundaries of the legislative districts for the election of  
34 members of the Senate and the House of Delegates, which plan shall conform to Sections  
35 2, 3 and 4 of this Article. If a plan has been adopted by the General Assembly by the 45th  
36 day after the opening of the regular session of the General Assembly in the second year  
37 following every census, the plan adopted by the General Assembly shall become law. If no  
38 plan has been adopted by the General Assembly for these purposes by the 45th day after  
39 the opening of the regular session of the General Assembly in the second year following  
40 every census, the Governor's plan presented to the General Assembly shall become law.

1           Upon petition of any registered voter, the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF**  
2 **MARYLAND** shall have original jurisdiction to review the legislative districting of the State  
3 and may grant appropriate relief, if it finds that the districting of the State is not consistent  
4 with requirements of either the Constitution of the United States of America, or the  
5 Constitution of Maryland.

6 30.

7           Every bill, when passed by the General Assembly, and sealed with the Great Seal,  
8 shall be presented by the presiding officer of the House in which it originated to the  
9 Governor for [his] **THE GOVERNOR'S** approval. All bills passed during a regular or special  
10 session shall be presented to the Governor for [his] **THE GOVERNOR'S** approval no later  
11 than 20 days after adjournment. Within 30 days after presentment, if the Governor  
12 approves the bill, [he] **THE GOVERNOR** shall sign the same in the presence of the presiding  
13 officers and Chief Clerks of the Senate and House of Delegates. Every Law shall be recorded  
14 in the office of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, and in due time,  
15 be printed, published and certified under the Great Seal, to the several Courts, in the same  
16 manner as has been heretofore usual in this State.

18           (1) The General Assembly shall not appropriate any money out of the Treasury  
19 except in accordance with the provisions of this section.

20           (2) Every appropriation bill shall be either a Budget Bill, or a Supplementary  
21 Appropriation Bill, as hereinafter provided.

22           (3) On the third Wednesday in January in each year, (except in the case of a newly  
23 elected Governor, and then not later than ten days after the convening of the General  
24 Assembly), unless such time shall be extended by the General Assembly, the Governor shall  
25 submit to the General Assembly a Budget for the next ensuing fiscal year. Each Budget  
26 shall contain a complete plan of proposed expenditures and estimated revenues for said  
27 fiscal year and shall show the estimated surplus or deficit of revenues at the end of the  
28 preceding fiscal year. Accompanying each Budget shall be a statement showing: (a) the  
29 revenues and expenditures for the preceding fiscal year; (b) the current assets, liabilities,  
30 reserves and surplus or deficit of the State; (c) the debts and funds of the State; (d) an  
31 estimate of the State's financial condition as of the beginning and end of the preceding fiscal  
32 year; (e) any explanation the Governor may desire to make as to the important features of  
33 the Budget and any suggestions as to methods for reduction or increase of the State's  
34 revenue.

35           (4) Each Budget shall embrace an estimate of all appropriations in such form and  
36 detail as the Governor shall determine or as may be prescribed by law, as follows: (a) for  
37 the General Assembly as certified to the Governor in the manner hereinafter provided; (b)  
38 for the Executive Department; (c) for the Judiciary Department, as provided by law, as

1 certified to the Governor; (d) to pay and discharge the principal and interest of the debt of  
2 the State in conformity with Section 34 of Article III of the Constitution, and all laws  
3 enacted in pursuance thereof; (e) for the salaries payable by the State and under the  
4 Constitution and laws of the State; (f) for the establishment and maintenance throughout  
5 the State of a thorough and efficient system of public schools in conformity with Article 8  
6 of the Constitution and with the laws of the State; and (g) for such other purposes as are  
7 set forth in the Constitution or laws of the State.

8 (5) The Governor shall deliver to the presiding officer of each House the Budget  
9 and a bill for all the proposed appropriations of the Budget classified and in such form and  
10 detail as [he] **THE GOVERNOR** shall determine or as may be prescribed by law; and the  
11 presiding officer of each House shall promptly cause said bill to be introduced therein, and  
12 such bill shall be known as the "Budget Bill." The Governor may, with the consent of the  
13 General Assembly, before final action thereon by the General Assembly, amend or  
14 supplement said Budget to correct an oversight, provide funds contingent on passage of  
15 pending legislation or, in case of an emergency, by delivering such an amendment or  
16 supplement to the presiding officers of both Houses; and such amendment or supplement  
17 shall thereby become a part of said Budget Bill as an addition to the items of said bill or as  
18 a modification of or a substitute for any item of said bill such amendment or supplement  
19 may affect.

20 (5a) The Budget and the Budget Bill as submitted by the Governor to the General  
21 Assembly shall have a figure for the total of all proposed appropriations and a figure for  
22 the total of all estimated revenues available to pay the appropriations, and the figure for  
23 total proposed appropriations shall not exceed the figure for total estimated revenues.  
24 Neither the Governor in submitting an amendment or supplement to the Budget Bill nor  
25 the General Assembly in amending the Budget Bill shall thereby cause the figure for total  
26 proposed appropriations to exceed the figure for total estimated revenues, including any  
27 revisions, and in the Budget Bill as enacted the figure for total estimated revenues always  
28 shall be equal to or exceed the figure for total appropriations.

29 (6) The General Assembly shall not amend the Budget Bill so as to affect either  
30 the obligations of the State under Section 34 of Article III of the Constitution, or the  
31 provisions made by the laws of the State for the establishment and maintenance of a system  
32 of public schools or the payment of any salaries required to be paid by the State of Maryland  
33 by the Constitution.

34 (6a) In enacting a balanced Budget Bill each fiscal year as required under this  
35 Section, the General Assembly may amend the bill by increasing or diminishing the items  
36 therein relating to the General Assembly, and by increasing or diminishing the items  
37 therein relating to the judiciary, but except as hereinbefore specified, may not alter the bill  
38 except to strike out or reduce items therein, provided, however, that the salary or  
39 compensation of any public officer may not be decreased during the public officer's term  
40 of office. When passed by both Houses, the Budget Bill shall be presented to the Governor  
41 for approval or disapproval according to Section 17 of Article II of this Constitution.

42 (6b) In enacting a balanced Budget Bill as required under this Section for fiscal

1 year 2024 and each fiscal year thereafter, the General Assembly may amend the bill by  
2 increasing, diminishing, or adding items therein relating to the General Assembly, by  
3 increasing, diminishing, or adding items therein relating to the judiciary, and by  
4 increasing, diminishing, or adding items therein relating to the Executive Department,  
5 provided that the total of the appropriation for the Executive Department approved by the  
6 General Assembly does not exceed the total proposed appropriation for the Executive  
7 Department submitted by the Governor. The salary or compensation of any public officer  
8 may not be decreased during the public officer's term of office. When passed by both Houses,  
9 the Budget Bill shall be a law immediately without further action by the Governor.

10 (7) The Governor and such representatives of the executive departments, boards,  
11 officers and commissions of the State expending or applying for State's moneys, as have  
12 been designated by the Governor for this purpose, shall have the right, and when requested  
13 by either House of the General Assembly, it shall be their duty to appear and be heard with  
14 respect to any Budget Bill during the consideration thereof, and to answer inquiries relative  
15 thereto.

16 (8) Supplementary Appropriation Bill. Either House may consider other  
17 appropriations but both Houses shall not finally act upon such appropriations until after  
18 the Budget Bill has been finally acted upon by both Houses, and no such other  
19 appropriation shall be valid except in accordance with the provisions following: (a) Every  
20 such appropriation shall be embodied in a separate bill limited to some single work, object  
21 or purpose therein stated and called herein a Supplementary Appropriation Bill; (b) Each  
22 Supplementary Appropriation Bill shall provide the revenue necessary to pay the  
23 appropriation thereby made by a tax, direct or indirect, to be levied and collected as shall  
24 be directed in said bill; (c) No Supplementary Appropriation Bill shall become a law unless  
25 it be passed in each House by a vote of a majority of the whole number of the members  
26 elected, and the yeas and nays recorded on its final passage; (d) Each Supplementary  
27 Appropriation Bill shall be presented to the Governor of the State as provided in Section  
28 17 of Article 2 of the Constitution and thereafter all the provisions of said section shall  
29 apply.

30 (9) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the General Assembly  
31 from passing at any time, in accordance with the provisions of Section 28 of Article 3 of the  
32 Constitution and subject to the Governor's power of approval as provided in Section 17 of  
33 Article 2 of the Constitution, an appropriation bill to provide for the payment of any  
34 obligation of the State within the protection of Section 10 of Article 1 of the Constitution of  
35 the United States.

36 (10) If the Budget Bill shall not have been finally acted upon by the Legislature  
37 seven days before the expiration of the regular session, the Governor shall issue a  
38 proclamation extending the session for some further period as may, in [his] **THE**  
39 **GOVERNOR'S** judgment, be necessary for the passage of such bill; but no matter other than  
40 such bill shall be considered during such extended session except a provision for the cost  
41 thereof.

42 (11) For the purpose of making up the Budget, the Governor shall require from the

1 proper State officials (including all executive departments, all executive and administrative  
2 offices, bureaus, boards, commissions and agencies that expend or supervise the  
3 expenditure of, and all institutions applying, for State moneys and appropriations) such  
4 itemized estimates and other information, in such form and at such times as directed by  
5 the Governor. An estimate for a program required to be funded by a law which will be in  
6 effect during the fiscal year covered by the Budget and which was enacted before July 1 of  
7 the fiscal year prior to that date shall provide a level of funding not less than that prescribed  
8 in the law. The estimates for the Legislative Department, certified by the presiding officer  
9 of each House, of the Judiciary, as provided by law, certified by the [Chief Judge] **CHIEF**  
10 **JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, and for the public  
11 schools, as provided by law, shall be transmitted to the Governor, in such form and at such  
12 times as directed by the Governor, and shall be included in the Budget without revision.

13 (12) The Governor may provide for public hearings on all estimates and may  
14 require the attendance at such hearings of representatives of all agencies, and for all  
15 institutions applying for State moneys. After such public hearings [he] **THE GOVERNOR**  
16 may, in [his] **THE GOVERNOR'S** discretion, revise all estimates except those for the  
17 legislative and judiciary departments, and for the public schools, as provided by law, and  
18 except that [he] **THE GOVERNOR** may not reduce an estimate for a program below a level  
19 of funding prescribed by a law which will be in effect during the fiscal year covered by the  
20 Budget, and which was enacted before July 1 of the fiscal year prior thereto.

21 (13) The General Assembly may, from time to time, enact such laws not  
22 inconsistent with this section, as may be necessary and proper to carry out its provisions.

23 (14) In the event of any inconsistency between any of the provisions of this Section  
24 and any of the other provisions of the Constitution, the provisions of this Section shall  
25 prevail. But nothing herein shall in any manner affect the provisions of Section 34 of Article  
26 3 of the Constitution or of any laws heretofore or hereafter passed in pursuance thereof, or  
27 be construed as preventing the Governor from calling extraordinary sessions of the General  
28 Assembly, as provided by Section 16 of Article 2, or as preventing the General Assembly at  
29 such [ertraordinary] **EXTRAORDINARY** sessions from considering any emergency  
30 appropriation or appropriations.

31 (15) If any item of any appropriation bill passed under the provisions of this  
32 Section shall be held invalid upon any ground, such invalidity shall not affect the legality  
33 of the bill or of any other item of such bill or bills.

#### 34 **Article IV – Judiciary Department**

35 1.

36 The Judicial power of this State is vested in a [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT**  
37 **OF MARYLAND**, such intermediate courts of appeal as the General Assembly may create  
38 by law, Circuit Courts, Orphans' Courts, and a District Court. These Courts shall be Courts  
39 of Record, and each shall have a seal to be used in the authentication of all process issuing

1 from it.

2 3.

3 Except for the Judges of the District Court, the Judges of the several Courts other  
4 than the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** or any intermediate courts  
5 of appeal shall, subject to the provisions of Section 5 of this Article of the Constitution, be  
6 elected in Baltimore City and in each county, by the qualified voters of the city and of each  
7 county, respectively, all of the said Judges to be elected at the general election to be held  
8 on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November, as now provided for in the Constitution.  
9 Each of the said Judges shall hold [his] **THE** office for the term of fifteen years from the  
10 time of [his] **THE** election, and until [his] **THE JUDGE'S** successor is elected and qualified,  
11 or until [he] **THE JUDGE** shall have attained the age of seventy years, whichever may first  
12 happen, and be reeligible thereto until [he] **THE JUDGE** shall have attained the age of  
13 seventy years, and not after. In case of the inability of any of said Judges to discharge [his]  
14 **THE JUDGE'S** duties with efficiency, by reason of continued sickness, or of physical or  
15 mental infirmity, it shall be in the power of the General Assembly, two-thirds of the  
16 members of each House concurring, with the approval of the Governor to retire said Judge  
17 from office.

18 3A.

19 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, any former  
20 judge, except a former judge of the Orphans' Court, may be assigned by the [Chief Judge]  
21 **CHIEF JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, upon  
22 approval of a majority of the court, to sit temporarily in any court of this State, except an  
23 Orphans' Court, as provided by law.

24 (2) (i) A retired judge of the Circuit Court for Montgomery County that  
25 sits as the Orphans' Court for Montgomery County may be assigned by the [Chief Judge]  
26 **CHIEF JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, upon  
27 approval of a majority of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, to do  
28 an act that a judge of the Orphans' Court for Montgomery County is authorized to perform.

29 (ii) A retired judge of the Circuit Court for Harford County that sits  
30 as the Orphans' Court for Harford County may be assigned by the [Chief Judge] **CHIEF**  
31 **JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, upon approval of  
32 a majority of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, to do an act that  
33 a judge of the Orphans' Court for Harford County is authorized to perform.

34 (b) The provisions of this section apply, notwithstanding provisions appearing

37 (a) (1) The Commission on Judicial Disabilities has the power to:

1 (i) Investigate complaints against any **JUSTICE OR** judge of the  
2 **[Court of Appeals] SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, any intermediate courts of appeal,  
3 the circuit courts, the District Court of Maryland, or the orphans' court; and

4 (ii) Conduct hearings concerning such complaints, administer oaths  
5 and affirmations, issue process to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production  
6 of evidence, and require persons to testify and produce evidence by granting them immunity  
7 from prosecution or from penalty or forfeiture.

8 (2) The Commission has the power to issue a reprimand and the power to  
9 recommend to the **[Court of Appeals] SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** the removal,  
10 censure, or other appropriate disciplining of a **JUSTICE OR** judge or, in an appropriate case,  
11 retirement.

12 (3) All proceedings, testimony, and evidence before the Commission shall  
13 be confidential and privileged, except as provided by rule of the **[Court of Appeals]**  
14 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**; the record and any proceeding filed with the **[Court of**  
15 **Appeals] SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall lose its confidential character, except  
16 as ordered by the **[Court of Appeals] SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**.

17 (4) No **JUSTICE OR** judge shall participate as a member of the Commission  
18 in any proceedings involving that **JUSTICE'S OR** judge's own conduct, and the Governor  
19 shall appoint another **JUSTICE OR** judge as a substitute member of the Commission for  
20 those proceedings.

21 (5) The **[Court of Appeals] SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall  
22 prescribe by rule the means to implement and enforce the powers of the Commission and  
23 the practice and procedure before the Commission.

24 (b) (1) Upon any recommendation of the Commission, the **[Court of Appeals]**  
25 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, after a hearing and upon a finding of misconduct while  
26 in office, or of persistent failure to perform the duties of the office, or of conduct prejudicial  
27 to the proper administration of justice, may remove the **JUSTICE OR** judge from office or  
28 may censure or otherwise discipline the **JUSTICE OR** judge, or the **[Court of Appeals]**  
29 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, after hearing and upon a finding of disability which is  
30 or is likely to become permanent and which seriously interferes with the performance of  
31 the **JUSTICE'S OR** judge's duties, may retire the **JUSTICE OR** judge from office.

32 (2) A **JUSTICE OR** judge removed under this section, and the **JUSTICE'S**  
33 **OR** judge's surviving spouse, shall have the rights and privileges accruing from the  
34 **JUSTICE'S OR** judge's judicial service only to the extent prescribed by the order of removal.

35 (3) A **JUSTICE OR** judge retired under this section shall have the rights  
36 and privileges prescribed by law for other retired **JUSTICES OR** judges.

1 (4) No [judge] **JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF**  
2 **MARYLAND** shall sit in judgment in any hearing involving that [judge's] **JUSTICE'S** own  
3 conduct.

4 (c) This section is alternative to, and cumulative with, the methods of retirement  
5 and removal provided in Sections 3 and 4 of this Article, and in Section 26 of Article III of  
6 this Constitution.

7 5A.

8 (a) A vacancy in the office of a **JUSTICE OR** judge of an appellate court, whether  
9 occasioned by the death, resignation, removal, retirement, disqualification by reason of age,  
10 or rejection by the voters of an incumbent, the creation of the office of a **JUSTICE OR** judge,  
11 or otherwise, shall be filled as provided in this section.

12 (b) Upon the occurrence of a vacancy the Governor shall appoint, by and with the  
13 advice and consent of the Senate, a person duly qualified to fill said office who shall hold  
14 the same until the election for continuance in office as provided in subsections (c) and (d).

15 (c) The continuance in office of a [judge] **JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals]  
16 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** is subject to approval or rejection by the registered  
17 voters of the appellate judicial circuit from which [he] **THE JUSTICE** was appointed at the  
18 next general election following the expiration of one year from the date of the occurrence of  
19 the vacancy which [he] **THE JUSTICE** was appointed to fill, and at the general election next  
20 occurring every ten years thereafter.

21 (d) The continuance in office of a judge of the [Court of Special Appeals]  
22 **APPELLATE COURT OF MARYLAND** is subject to approval or rejection by the registered  
23 voters of the geographical area prescribed by law at the next general election following the  
24 expiration of one year from the date of the occurrence of the vacancy which [he] **THE JUDGE**  
25 was appointed to fill, and at the general election next occurring every ten years thereafter.

26 (e) The approval or rejection by the registered voters of a **JUSTICE OR** judge as  
27 provided for in subsections (c) and (d) shall be a vote for the **JUSTICE'S OR** judge's retention  
28 in office for a term of ten years or [his] **THE JUSTICE'S OR JUDGE'S** removal. The  
29 **JUSTICE'S OR** judge's name shall be on the appropriate ballot, without opposition, and the  
30 voters shall vote yes or no for [his] **THE JUSTICE'S OR JUDGE'S** retention in office. If the  
31 voters reject the retention in office of a **JUSTICE OR** judge, or if the vote is tied, the office  
32 becomes vacant ten days after certification of the election returns.

33 (f) An appellate court **JUSTICE OR** judge shall retire when [he] **THE JUSTICE**  
34 **OR JUDGE** attains [his] **THE JUSTICE'S OR JUDGE'S** seventieth birthday.

35 (g) A member of the General Assembly who is otherwise qualified for

1 appointment to judicial office is not disqualified by reason of [his] **THE MEMBER'S**  
2 membership in a General Assembly which proposed or enacted any constitutional  
3 amendment or statute affecting the method of selection[, Continuance], **CONTINUANCE** in  
4 office, or retirement or removal of a **JUSTICE OR** judge, the creation or abolition of a court,  
5 an increase or decrease in the number of **JUSTICES OR** judges of any court, or an increase  
6 or decrease in the salary, pension or other allowances of any **JUSTICE OR** judge.

8 (a) (1) The Clerks of the Courts shall have charge and custody of records and  
9 other papers and shall perform all the duties which appertain to their offices, as are  
10 regulated by Law.

11 (2) The office and business of the Clerks, in all their departments, shall be  
12 subject to and governed in accordance with rules adopted by the [Court of Appeals]  
13 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** pursuant to Section 18 of this article.

14 (b) The offices of the Clerks shall be funded through the State budget. All fees,  
15 commissions, or other revenues established by Law for these offices shall be State revenues,  
16 unless provided otherwise by the General Assembly.

18 The [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall be composed of  
19 seven [judges] **JUSTICES**, one from the First Appellate Judicial Circuit consisting of  
20 Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico, and  
21 Worcester Counties; one from the Second Appellate Judicial Circuit consisting of Baltimore  
22 and Harford Counties; one from the Third Appellate Judicial Circuit, consisting of  
23 Allegany, Carroll, Frederick, Garrett, Howard, and Washington Counties; one from the  
24 Fourth Appellate Judicial Circuit, consisting of Prince George's County; one from the Fifth  
25 Appellate Judicial Circuit, consisting of Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Mary's  
26 Counties; one from the Sixth Appellate Judicial Circuit, consisting of Baltimore City; and  
27 one from the Seventh Appellate Judicial Circuit, consisting of Montgomery County. The  
28 [Judges] **JUSTICES** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall be  
29 residents of their respective Appellate Judicial Circuits. The term of each [Judge] **JUSTICE**  
30 of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall begin on the date of  
31 [his] **THE JUSTICE'S** qualification. One of the [Judges] **JUSTICES** of the [Court of  
32 Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall be designated by the Governor as the  
33 [Chief Judge] **CHIEF JUSTICE**. The jurisdiction of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME**  
34 **COURT OF MARYLAND** shall be co-extensive with the limits of the State and such as now  
35 is or may hereafter be prescribed by law. It shall hold its sessions in the City of Annapolis  
36 at such time or times as it shall from time to time by rule prescribe. Its session or sessions  
37 shall continue not less than ten months in each year, if the business before it shall so  
38 require, and it shall be competent for the [judges] **JUSTICES** temporarily to transfer their

6 for any case. The concurrence of a majority of those sitting shall be sufficient for the decision  
7 of any cause, and an equal division of those sitting in a case has the effect of affirming the  
8 decision appealed from if there is no application for reargument as hereinafter provided. In  
9 any case where there is an equal division or a three to two division of the [Court] **SUPREME**  
10 **COURT OF MARYLAND** a reargument before the full Court of seven [judges] **JUSTICES**  
11 shall be granted to the losing party upon application as a matter of right.

13 Any [judge] **JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**  
14 or of an intermediate court of appeal who heard the cause below either as a trial judge or  
15 as a judge of any intermediate court of appeal as the case may be shall not participate in  
16 the decision. In every case an opinion, in writing, shall be filed within three months after  
17 the argument, or submission of the cause; and the judgment of the [Court of Appeals]  
18 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall be final and conclusive.

20 Provision shall be made by Law for publishing Reports of all causes, argued and  
21 determined in the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** and in the  
22 intermediate courts of appeal, which the **JUSTICES OR** judges thereof, respectively, shall  
23 designate as proper for publication.

25 There shall be a Clerk of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**,  
26 who shall be appointed by and shall hold [his] **THE** office at the pleasure of said [Court of  
27 Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**.

29 (a) The [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** from time to time  
30 shall adopt rules and regulations concerning the practice and procedure in and the  
31 administration of the appellate courts and in the other courts of this State, which shall  
32 have the force of law until rescinded, changed or modified by the [Court of Appeals]  
33 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** or otherwise by law. The power of courts other than  
34 the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** to make rules of practice and  
35 procedure, or administrative rules, shall be subject to the rules and regulations adopted by  
36 the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** or otherwise by law.

1 (b) (1) The [Chief Judge] **CHIEF JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals]  
2 **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** shall be the administrative head of the Judicial system  
3 of the State. The [Chief Judge] **CHIEF JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME**  
4 **COURT OF MARYLAND** shall from time to time require, from each of the judges of the  
5 Circuit Courts, of the District Court and of any intermediate courts of appeal, reports as to  
6 the judicial work and business of each of the judges and their respective courts.

7 (2) Subject to paragraphs (3) and (4) of this subsection, the [Chief Judge]

14 the Orphans' Court for Montgomery County may be assigned by the [Chief Judge] **CHIEF**  
15 **JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, upon approval of  
16 a majority of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, to do an act that  
17 a judge of the Orphans' Court for Montgomery County is authorized to perform.

18 (4) A retired judge of the Circuit Court for Harford County that sits as the  
19 Orphans' Court for Harford County may be assigned by the [Chief Judge] **CHIEF JUSTICE**  
20 of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, upon approval of a majority  
21 of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, to do an act that a judge of  
22 the Orphans' Court for Harford County is authorized to perform.

23 (5) Any **JUSTICE OR** judge assigned by the [Chief Judge] **CHIEF JUSTICE**  
24 of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** pursuant to this section has  
25 all the power and authority pertaining to a **JUSTICE OR** judge of the court to which the  
26 **JUSTICE OR** judge is so assigned; and the **JUSTICE'S OR** judge's power and authority shall  
27 continue with respect to all cases (including any motion, or other matters incidental  
28 thereto) which may come before the **JUSTICE OR** judge by virtue of such assignment until  
29 the **JUSTICE'S OR** judge's action thereon shall be completed. In the absence of the [Chief  
30 Judge] **CHIEF JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**, the  
31 provisions of this section shall be applicable to the senior [judge] **JUSTICE** present in the  
32 [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**. The powers of the [Chief Judge]  
33 **CHIEF JUSTICE** set forth in this section shall be subject to any rule or regulation adopted  
34 by the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND**.

36 Where any trial is conducted by less than three Circuit Judges, upon the decision or  
37 determination of any point, or question, by the Court, it shall be competent to the party,  
38 against whom the ruling or decision is made, upon motion, to have the point, or question  
39 reserved for the consideration of three Judges of the Circuit, who shall constitute a court

1 in banc for such purpose; and the motion for such reservation shall be entered of record,  
2 during the sitting at which such decision may be made; and the procedure for appeals to

12 may hereafter be made by Law.

14 The [Chief Judge] **CHIEF JUSTICE** of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF**  
15 **MARYLAND** shall designate one judge of the District Court as Chief Judge of that Court,  
16 to serve as Chief Judge at [his] **THE CHIEF JUSTICE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF**  
17 **MARYLAND'S** pleasure. The Chief Judge of the District Court may assign administrative

22 It shall be the duty of the Clerk of the [Court of Appeals] **SUPREME COURT OF**  
23 **MARYLAND** and the Clerks of any intermediate courts of appeal, respectively, whenever a  
24 case shall be brought into said Courts, in which the State is a party or has interest,  
25 immediately to notify the Attorney General thereof.

## 26 **Article XVII – Quadrennial Elections**

28 All State and county officers elected by qualified voters (except judges of the Circuit  
29 Courts, [judges of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, judges of the Court of Appeals]  
30 **JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT OF MARYLAND** and judges of any intermediate  
31 courts of appeal) shall hold office for terms of four years, and until their successors shall  
32 qualify.

33 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That, as provided in this Act:

34 (a) The Supreme Court of Maryland is the successor to the Court of Appeals.

35 (b) The Appellate Court of Maryland is the successor to the Court of Special

1 Appeals.

2 (c) A Justice of the Supreme Court of Maryland is the successor to a Judge of the  
3 Court of Appeals.

4 (d) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Maryland is the successor to the  
5 Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals.

6 (e) The Chief Judge of the Appellate Court of Maryland is the successor to the  
7 Chief Judge of the Court of Special Appeals.

8 (f) A Judge of the Appellate Court of Maryland is the successor to a Judge of the  
9 Court of Special Appeals.

10 (g) The Clerk of the Supreme Court of Maryland is the successor to the Clerk of  
11 the Court of Appeals.

12 (h) The Clerk of the Appellate Court of Maryland is the successor to the Clerk of  
13 the Court of Special Appeals.

14 (i) In every law, executive order, rule, regulation, policy, or document created by  
15 an official, an employee, or a unit of this State, the names and titles of those units and  
16 officials mean the names and titles of the successor unit or official.

17 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That nothing in this Act affects the  
18 term of office of an appointed or elected member of any commission, office, department,  
19 agency, or other unit. An individual who is a member of a unit on the effective date of this  
20 Act shall remain a member for the balance of the term to which appointed or elected unless  
21 the member sooner dies, resigns, or is removed under provisions of law.

22 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any transaction or  
23 employment status affected by or flowing from any change of nomenclature or any statute  
24 amended by this Act and validly entered into or existing before the effective date of this Act  
25 and every right, duty, or interest flowing from a statute amended by this Act remains valid  
26 after the effective date of this Act and may be terminated, completed, consummated, or  
27 enforced as required or allowed by any statute amended by this Act as though the  
28 amendment had not occurred. If a change in nomenclature involves a change in name or  
29 designation of any State unit, the successor unit shall be considered in all respects as  
30 having the powers and obligations granted the former unit.

31 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

32 (1) the continuity of every commission, office, department, agency, or other  
33 unit is retained; and

34 (2) the personnel, records, files, furniture, fixtures, and other properties  
35 and all appropriations, credits, assets, liabilities, and obligations of each retained unit are

1 continued as the personnel, records, files, furniture, fixtures, properties, appropriations,  
2 credits, assets, liabilities, and obligations of the unit under the laws enacted by this Act.

3 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That letterhead, business cards,  
4 and other documents reflecting the renaming of the Court of Appeals to be the Supreme  
5 Court of Maryland, the renaming of the Court of Special Appeals to be the Appellate Court  
6 of Maryland, the renaming of a Judge of the Court of Appeals to be a Justice of the Supreme  
7 Court of Maryland, or the renaming of the Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals to be the  
8 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Maryland may not be used until all letterhead,  
9 business cards, and other documents already in print and reflecting the name of the Court  
10 of Appeals, the Court of Special Appeals, a Judge of the Court of Appeals, or the Chief Judge  
11 of the Court of Appeals before the effective date of this Act have been used.

12 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the  
13 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the  
14 Department of Legislative Services, shall correct, with no further action required by the  
15 General Assembly, cross-references and terminology rendered incorrect by this Act. The  
16 publisher shall adequately describe any correction that is made in an editor's note following  
17 the section affected.

18 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly  
19 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by Section 1 of this  
20 Act affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland  
21 Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.

22 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the amendment to the  
23 Maryland Constitution proposed by Section 1 of this Act shall be submitted to the qualified  
24 voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2022 for adoption or  
25 rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election,  
26 the vote on the proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and on each  
27 ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against  
28 the Constitutional Amendment", as now provided by law. Immediately after the election,  
29 all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed  
30 amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further  
31 proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
