A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Secretary of Health – School–Based Health Centers – Guidelines and**
3 **Administration of Grants**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health, in consultation with the State
5 Department of Education and other stakeholders, to develop guidelines to support
6 the expansion of school–based health centers; requiring the Maryland Department
7 of Health, in conjunction with the State Department of Education, to report to the
8 General Assembly on or before a certain date on a plan to transfer the administration
9 of school–based health center grants from the State Department of Education to the
10 Bureau of Maternal and Child Health within the Maryland Department of Health;
11 requiring the Governor to transfer the administration of school–based health center
12 grants from the State Department of Education to the Bureau of Maternal and Child
13 Health within the Maryland Department of Health on or before a certain date; and
14 generally relating to school–based health centers.

27 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
28 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (A) **THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF**
6 **EDUCATION AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS, SHALL DEVELOP GUIDELINES TO**
7 **SUPPORT THE EXPANSION OF SCHOOL–BASED HEALTH CENTERS.**

10 **PART II. MARYLAND COUNCIL ON ADVANCEMENT OF SCHOOL–BASED HEALTH**
11 **CENTERS.**

12 [**19–22A–01.**] **19–22A–04.**

13 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

14 (b) “Commission” means the Maryland Community Health Resources
15 Commission.

16 (c) “Council” means the Maryland Council on Advancement of School–Based
17 Health Centers.

18 [**19–22A–02.**] **19–22A–05.**

19 (a) There is a Maryland Council on Advancement of School–Based Health Centers
20 in the Department.

21 (b) The purpose of the Council is to improve the health and educational outcomes
22 of students who receive services from school–based health centers by advancing the
23 integration of school–based health centers into:

24 (1) The health care system at the State and local levels; and

25 (2) The educational system at the State and local levels.

26 (c) (1) Staff support for the Council shall be provided by the Commission.

27 (2) The Commission may seek the assistance of organizations with

1 expertise in school-based health care or other matters within the duties of the Council
2 provided in § [19-22A-05] ~~19-22A-08~~ of this subtitle to provide additional staffing
3 resources to the Commission and the Council.

5 (a) The Council consists of the following 15 voting members and 6 ex officio
6 members:

7 (1) One member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of
8 the Senate, as an ex officio member;

9 (2) One member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the
10 House, as an ex officio member;

11 (3) The Secretary of Health, or a designee of the Secretary, as an ex officio
12 member;

13 (4) The State Superintendent of Schools as an ex officio member;

14 (5) The Executive Director of the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange as an
15 ex officio member;

16 (6) The Chairman of the Commission, or a designee of the Chairman, as an
17 ex officio member; and

18 (7) The following 15 members, appointed by the Governor:

19 (i) The President of the Maryland Assembly on School-Based
20 Health Care, or a designee of the President;

21 (ii) Three representatives of school-based health centers, nominated
22 by the Maryland Assembly on School-Based Health Care:

23 1. From a diverse array of sponsoring organizations; and

24 2. For at least one of the representatives, from a nursing
25 background;

26 (iii) One representative of the Public Schools Superintendents
27 Association of Maryland;

28 (iv) One representative of the Maryland Association of Boards of
29 Education;

30 (v) One elementary school principal of a school that has a
31 school-based health center;

1 (vi) One secondary school principal of a school that has a
2 school-based health center;

3 (vii) One representative of the Maryland Hospital Association;

4 (viii) One representative of the Maryland Association of County
5 Health Officers;

6 (ix) One representative of a federally qualified health center,
7 nominated by the Mid-Atlantic Association of Community Health Centers;

8 (x) One representative of a managed care organization;

9 (xi) One representative of a commercial health insurance carrier;

10 (xii) One pediatrician, nominated by the Maryland Chapter of the
11 American Academy of Pediatrics; and

12 (xiii) One parent or guardian of a student who utilizes services at a
13 school-based health center.

14 (b) In making the appointments required under this section, the Governor shall
15 ensure that the Council is representative of:

16 (1) The geographic regions of the State; and

17 (2) Minority populations of the State.

18 (c) (1) The term of a member appointed under subsection (a) of this section is
19 3 years.

20 (2) The terms of voting members are staggered as required by the terms
21 provided for members of the Council on October 1, 2015.

22 (3) At the end of a term, a member shall continue to serve until a successor
23 is appointed and qualifies.

24 (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun shall serve for the
25 rest of the term or until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

26 (d) The Governor shall appoint a successor in the event of a vacancy on the
27 Council.

28 (e) From among the members of the Council, the voting members of the Council
29 shall elect a chair for a 2-year term.

1 (f) A member of the Council may not receive compensation but is entitled to
2 reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in
3 the State budget.

5 (a) A majority of the members then serving on the Council is a quorum.

6 (b) The Council shall determine the times and places of its meetings and any
7 other necessary operating procedures in accordance with the Open Meetings Act.

8 (c) (1) The Council may establish workgroups to advise the Council on specific
9 issues, including behavioral health, oral health, and primary care.

10 (2) (i) The chair of the Council shall appoint the members of a
11 workgroup established by the Council under paragraph (1) of this subsection.

12 (ii) The chair of the Council may appoint the following individuals to
13 a workgroup:

14 1. Members of the Council with expertise in the issue to be
15 studied; and

16 2. Members of the public, including consumers and
17 stakeholder group representatives, with expertise in the area to be studied.

18 **[19–22A–05.] 19–22A–08.**

19 (a) The Council shall develop policy recommendations to improve the health and
20 educational outcomes of students who receive services from school–based health centers by:

21 (1) Supporting local community efforts to establish or expand school–based
22 health center capacity in primary care, behavioral health, and oral health;

23 (2) Integrating school–based health centers into existing and emerging
24 patient–centered models of care;

25 (3) Promoting the inclusion of school–based health centers in networks of
26 managed care organizations and commercial health insurance carriers;

27 (4) Advancing the public health goals of State and local health officials;

28 (5) Promoting the inclusion of school–based health centers into networks
29 of school health services and coordinated student service models for the range of services
30 offered in school settings;

31 (6) Supporting State and local initiatives to promote student success;

1 (7) Reviewing and revising best practice guidelines; and

2 (8) Supporting the long-term sustainability of school-based health
3 centers.

4 (b) The Council shall review the collection and analysis of school-based health
5 center data collected by the State Department of Education to:

6 (1) Make recommendations on best practices for the collection and analysis
7 of the data; and

8 (2) Provide guidance on the development of findings and recommendations
9 based on the data.

10 (c) The Council shall conduct other activities the Council considers appropriate
11 to meet the purpose of the Council.

12 (d) On or before December 31 of each year, the Council shall report the findings
13 and recommendations of the Council to the Maryland Department of Health, the State
14 Department of Education, the Commission, and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State
15 Government Article, the General Assembly on improving the health and educational
16 outcomes of students who receive services from school-based health centers.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

18 (a) On or before October 1, 2021, the Maryland Department of Health, in
19 conjunction with the State Department of Education, shall report to the General Assembly,
20 in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, on a plan to transfer the
21 administration of school-based health center grants and any related functions from the
22 State Department of Education to the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health within the
23 Maryland Department of Health.

24 (b) On or before July 1, 2022, the Governor shall transfer the administration of
25 school-based health center grants and any related functions from the State Department of
26 Education to the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health within the Maryland Department
27 of Health.

28 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
29 1, 2021.
