Department of Housing and Community Development – Appraisal Gap From Historic Redlining Financial Assistance Program – Establishment

FOR the purpose of establishing the Appraisal Gap From Historic Redlining Financial Assistance Program in the Department of Housing and Community Development; providing for the purpose of the Program; authorizing a certain person to request certain financial assistance to cover the appraisal gap for certain property in a certain area if certain construction expenses exceed the sales price of the property; providing for the calculation of the financial assistance; authorizing the financial assistance to be used in conjunction with certain State, federal, or local funding sources; requiring the Department, on application by a certain individual or business entity, to provide financial assistance in a timely manner on a first-come, first-served basis, subject to certain limitations; establishing the Appraisal Gap From Historic Redlining Financial Assistance Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; providing for the investment of money in and expenditures from the Fund; requiring the Governor to include a certain appropriation to the Fund in the annual budget bill: requiring the Comptroller to transfer certain amounts from the Fund to the General Fund of the State under certain circumstances; prohibiting the Governor from reducing a certain appropriation to the Fund; providing for the uses of the Fund; requiring a certain county to make a certain report to the Department on or before a certain date each year; requiring the Department to make a certain report to certain committees on or before a certain date each year; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations; requiring the Department to perform a certain study and submit a report on the study by a certain date; defining certain
