11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Blue Line Corridor Public Art Project is a place making project within the the County's economic development cluster goals. The purpose of the project is to construct anchoring public art installations that will leverage and brand community assets along the Blue Line Corridor while establishing neighborhood connectivity, cultural authenticity and equity and inclusion. The project has two intersecting scopes. Destination Prince Georges: Telling Our Story in downtown Largo will be designed and constructed as a pedestrian and bike-able public art walk along McCormick Drive starting at Route 202 and ending at Largo Metro in coordination with the Blue Line Corridor Complete Streets. Addison Road Metro - Seat Pleasant Public Art Facade Improvement is a capital visual enhancement designed and constructed along the blank facades of infrastructure to activate the Addison Road-Seat Pleasant node collaborating with WMATA as part of PGAHC's ongoing partnership.
