The Harford County Chapter (HCC-IWLA) was incorporated on the 30th of August 1958 as a 501c3 nonprofit corporation of the state of Maryland. The HCC-IWLA was established exclusively for SCIENTIFIC and EDUCATIONAL purposes. Our mission is to conserve, maintain, protect and restore all soil, water, wildlife and other natural resources and to promote means and opportunities for the education the public with respect to such resources and the enjoyment and wholesome utilization thereof. We are a 100% volunteer organization with a focus on conservation of Marylands natural resources through community education and engagement. We also partner with the Anita C. Leight Estuary Center, Chesapeake Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve, and local school systems.						

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The proposed project intends to construct a community access Conservation and Education Center (CEC) at 2800 Willoughby Beach Road in Edgewood, MD. The CEC will serve as both the chapter house for the HCC-IWLA and as a community outreach center. As a chapter house it will serve to provide space for monthly meetings (open to public and featuring guest speakers) & chapter sponsored conservation projects. As a community outreach center the building will serve as a home base for a proposed community garden, and a space to host field science experiences with local school groups. The building is intended to be built as a demonstration project for sustainable design and construction with a focus on "green" technologies and minimal environmental impact. The land on which the CEC will be built will be acquired from the Harford Land Trust, and connects to the larger Bosely conservancy owned by the HCC-IWLA but open for public access for fishing, hiking, and

This bond initiative request is to cover the cost of acquiring the land upon which the proposed CEC will be constructed. The HCC-IWLA is in possession of the funds required to build the CEC, has negotiated and finalized a contract of sale and environmental easement with the Harford Land Trust and Maryland Environmental Trust and has permitted use approval from Harford County Department of Planning and Zoning. We have also down selected a local Maryland contractor, and finalized a building layout and construction plan. In other words, this project is SHOVEL READY as soon as we secure funding for the purchase of the land.

An added benefit to the state of Maryland is that we are currently in negotiation with and willing to permit Tier II replanting on ~8 acres of this land which will help to satisfy MDTA's environmental regulations associated with the I-95 ETL expansion in Harford County. Further, by purchasing the land from the Harford Land Trust, the funds will go directly toward the purchase and conservation of additional land in Harford County, and is supporting a second non-profit organization during the difficult times the COVID-19 pandemic has placed on non-profit organizations. This in effect compounds the investment by benefitting a second non-profit as well as the community.
