| <p>The City of Rockvilles Recreation & Parks provides recreational and educational programs and facilities for area residents of all ages. The Lincoln Park Community Center serves the public through a variety of programs, rentals, and special events. Based on the results of community needs assessments, surveys, and trends, the center provides more than 600 programs including afterschool, sports, fitness, and events throughout the year. The facility is also used for 500+ community gatherings and meetings. The facility is open 12 hours/day 360 days/year, with 40,000+ visits/year. The center offers reduced-price memberships and course fee scholarships to serve customers with income limitations. Students contribute more than 700 volunteer hours/year at the center which helps them reach their graduation requirement for MCPS Student Service Learning hours.</p> | | |
