28. Comments

The MSBC Five Star Program, Inc. is a 501 (c) (3) Community Development Corporation that serves the West Baltimore City and County communities. We provide multi-generational community life sustaining support, educational and outreach services and resources that foster individual, community and economic development. Our services include providing youth and adult pathways to education, work preparedness, training, and mental health services. We help to close existing gaps in services provided by government and public organizations to help families become self-sustaining.

Our services and trainings include:

- -food insecurity program that has served over 18,700 families and 56,000 individuals, as well as mental health counseling services to over 600 individuals and families through our Renaissance Counseling Center since the pandemic ensued
- -academic education in partnership with local government and public health agencies
- -voter education and registration
- -daycare, after school tutoring and mentoring services
- -GED, driver education, job and career fairs
- -workforce re-entry workshops in partnership with State legislators (expungement workshops)
- -youth and young adult workplace readiness seminars and workshops
- -personal fulfillment opportunities such as basketball, chess, dance lessons, music and entertainment production training
- -entrepreneurial and small business seminars/workshops
- -community recreational training and activities for youth and adult

We currently operate using our MSBC Outreach Center and the partially renovated Star Family Life Center. With the completed renovation of our 32,000 square feet Star Family Life Center, we will be able to increase our services exponentially. While the pandemic has been a deterrent, we continue to be creative and provide as many of our services as possible. These include virtual classrooms for students before and after school; individual and family counseling services; and virtual platforms to help reach over 56 thousand recipients at our food drives

We continue to seek avenues to enhance our services such as:

- -expanding our current community programs to include vocational and trade programs as a partnering satellite location for local community colleges and other trades providers -exploring partnerships with organizations
- Christing partiterships with organizations
- -Comcast to provide free Wi-Fi to students and adults
- -ABC Baltimore.com for vocational training and industry seminars

As we continue to serve, we respectfully request the funds to continue to provide additional services at 1600 Whitehead Court in Woodlawn. With the additional funds, we will expand our reach to further enhance the services to this much needed West Baltimore population.
