BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health Occupations Section 8–513, 12–101(b), and 12–102(e) Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article – Health Occupations** 8-513. In this section, "perioperative assessment and management" means the assessment and management of a patient preoperatively, intraoperatively, and postoperatively.

13 14	(3) If an anesthesiologist is not available, a licensed physician for dentist, or PODIATRIST shall be available to provide this type of consultation.
15	(d) The nurse anesthetist shall ensure that a qualified anesthesia provider:
16	(1) Performs a thorough and complete preanesthetic assessment;
17 18	(2) Obtains informed consent for the planned anesthetic intervention from the patient or an individual responsible for the patient; and
19	(3) Formulates a patient–specific plan for anesthesia care.
20	(e) The nurse anesthetist as part of the standards of practice shall:
21 22	(1) Implement and adjust an anesthesia care plan as needed to adapt to the patient's response to the anesthesia;
23 24	(2) Monitor a patient's physiologic condition for untoward identifiable reactions and initiate appropriate corrective actions as required;
25 26	(3) Enter prompt, complete, and accurate documentation of pertinent information on a patient's record;
27 28	(4) Transfer responsibility for care of a patient to other qualified providers in a manner that ensures continuity of care and patient safety;

Ensure that appropriate safety precautions are taken to minimize the

risks of fire, explosion, electrical shock, and equipment malfunction;

- (6) 1 Maintain appropriate infection control standards; 2 (7)Evaluate anesthesia care to ensure its quality; 3 Maintain continual competence in anesthesia practice; and (8)4 (9)Respect and maintain the basic rights of patients. 5 This section may not be construed to require a written collaboration agreement between a nurse anesthetist and an anesthesiologist, a physician, for a dentist 6 7 OR A PODIATRIST. 8 12–101. 9 "Authorized prescriber" means any licensed dentist, licensed dental hygienist with prescriptive authority under § 4-206.4 of this article, licensed physician, licensed 10 11 podiatrist, licensed veterinarian, advanced practice nurse with prescriptive authority under § 8-508 of this article, LICENSED NURSE ANESTHETIST, or other individual 12 13 authorized by law to prescribe prescription or nonprescription drugs or devices. 14 12-102.15 (e) (1) This title does not prohibit: 16 A dentist, physician, or podiatrist from administering a (i) prescription drug or device in the course of treating a patient; [or] 17 18 (ii) A licensed dental hygienist from administering medication under $\S 4-206.4$ of this article; **OR** 19 20(III) A **NURSE ANESTHETIST** FROM ADMINISTERING MEDICATION UNDER § 8–513 OF THIS ARTICLE. 21
- 22 (2) For the purposes of paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection, "administering" 23 means the direct introduction of a single dosage of a drug or device at a given time, whether 24 by injection or other means, and whether in liquid, tablet, capsule, or other form.
