1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Agricultural Commission – Hemp Industry Member**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Maryland Agricultural Commission by
4 requiring the Governor to appoint a member from a list of a certain number of
5 nominees representing the hemp industry; and generally relating to the Maryland
6 Agricultural Commission.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
8 Article – Agriculture
9 Section 2–203(a)
10 Annotated Code of Maryland
11 (2016 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Agriculture**

16 (a) The Commission has [30] **31** members. One member is ex officio and is the
17 principal administrative official for agricultural affairs at the University System of

- 9 (4) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the tobacco

- 11 (5) Two from a list of at least four nominees representing the nursery
12 industry;
- 13 (6) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the horticulture
14 industry;
- 15 (7) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the field crops
16 industry;
- 17 (8) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the vegetable
18 industry;
- 19 (9) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the veterinary
20 profession;
- 21 (10) One from a list of at least two nominees of the Maryland State Grange;
- 22 (11) One from a list of at least two nominees of the Maryland Farm Bureau;
- 23 (12) Two without nomination appointed at large from services related to
24 agriculture;
- 25 (13) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the turf industry;
- 26 (14) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the
27 horse-breeding industry;
- 28 (15) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the food
29 processing industry;
- 30 (16) One without nomination appointed at large from the general public to
31 be the consumer member;

1 (17) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the organic
2 farming industry;

3 (18) One from a list of at least two nominees representing direct farm
4 marketing;

5 (19) One from a list of at least two nominees representing viticulture;

6 (20) One from a list of at least two nominees representing agriculture
7 education in primary or secondary schools;

8 (21) One from a list of at least two nominees representing agri-business;

9 (22) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the forestry
10 industry;

11 (23) One from a list of at least two nominees representing the aquaculture
12 industry;

13 (24) One from a list of at least two nominees representing agri-tourism;

15 (25) One from a list of two nominees representing the biofuel industry; AND

16 (26) ONE FROM A LIST OF AT LEAST TWO NOMINEES REPRESENTING
17 THE HEMP INDUSTRY.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 October 1, 2022.
